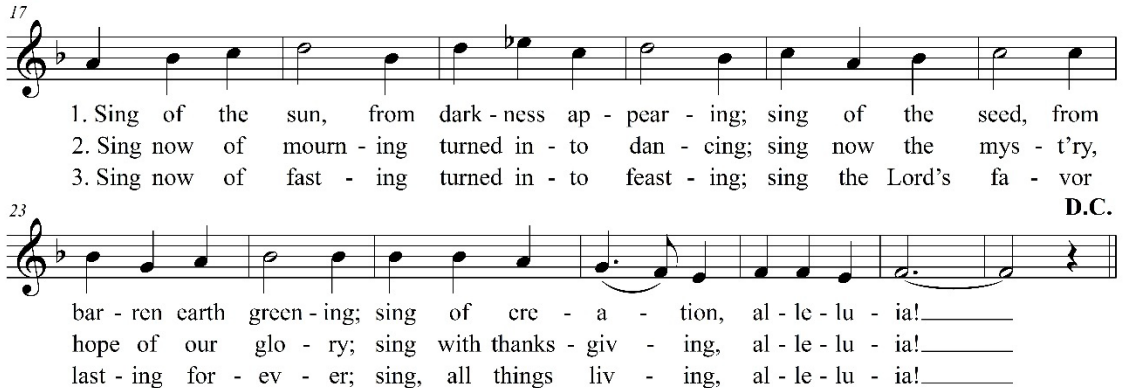

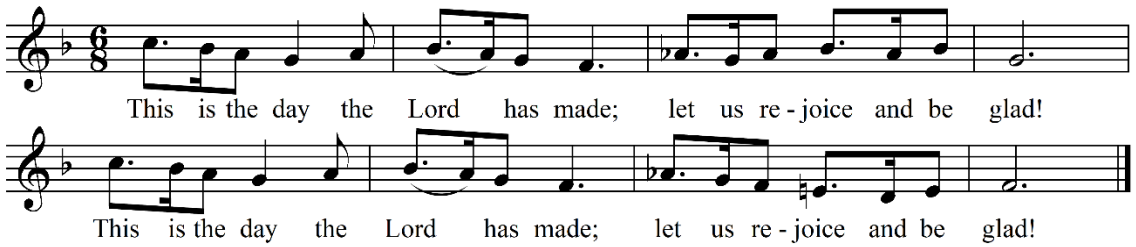

Acts 10:34-43

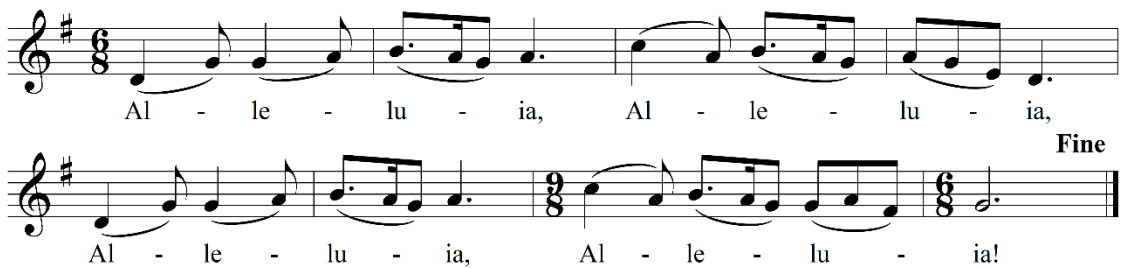

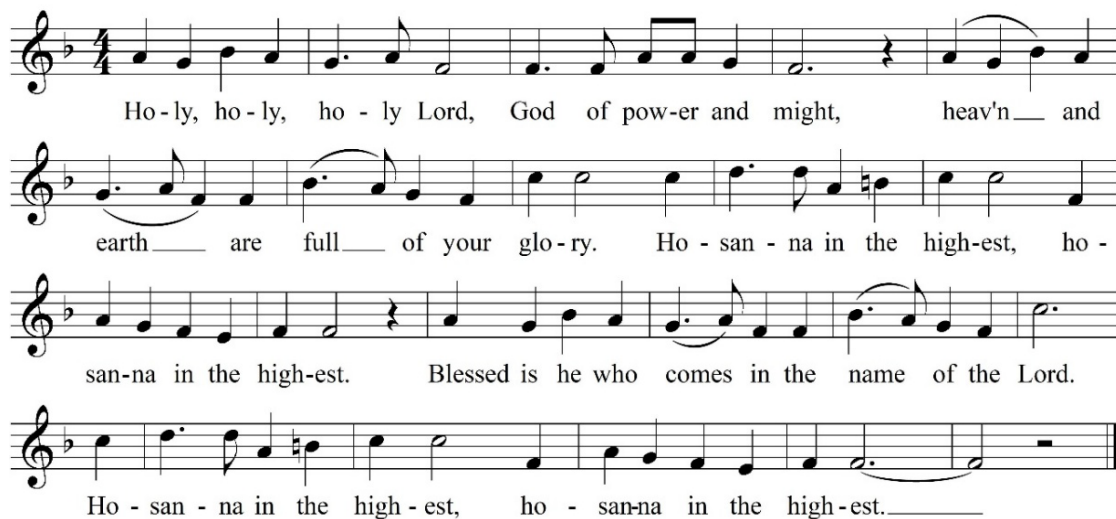
The Great Thanksgiving
