Good Afternoon Mill Falls Families,

It is once again that time of year, when we begin the state-mandated standardized assessment called the NH Standardized Assessment System or SAS (formerly known as Smarter Balanced).

On Monday, April 1st, our third through sixth year students will begin the first session of testing in either math or language. Our anticipated completion date will be Tuesday, April 9th.

As reminder SAS assessments are designed to measure real world skills like critical thinking and problem solving. This assessment is web-based, untimed and adaptive and as you know we will be using our iPads and Chromebooks to implement this task.

Where this obviously is a change from our normal routine, we have a few suggestions to make this testing time more comfortable for the students.

- For some classes, testing will begin shortly after morning drop off, so please be sure to be prompt in the arrival of students in the morning.
- A good night sleep and healthy breakfast are key to ensuring children are ready for this mental task. We want to be sure they have good energy, so sending along a selection of snacks and a water bottle will also be beneficial.
- While at home, remember to stay positive and support your children in this endeavor. This may be the first time students have ever taken an assessment with technology, and some children may express some frustrations with the task.
- If your child would like to bring in their own headphones or stylus pens, please encourage them to do so! Just remember to write their names on their headphones so that they are not misplaced.
- On our end, breaks are scheduled to ensure they have ample time to relax or work on different choices during the day. In addition, we are anticipating scheduling a different exercise-oriented class such as zumba or yoga for some extra special fun on a daily basis during the testing period.
