Description of session:

In this session participants will become familiar with the Edmonton Classification System for Cancer Pain (ECS-CP) and work through several case examples using the ECS-CP, exemplifying its application and usefulness as a clinical tool. Dr. Sellick and participants will also look at opioid starts, titrations, and rotation changes, and work through some examples together.

Megan Sellick is a palliative care physician who joined the Thunder Bay team in April 2022. Her clinical work focuses on caring for patients living with life-threatening cancer diagnoses. Academically, she is an Assistant Professor in the Division of Clinical Sciences at NOSM University and has maintained an Assistant Adjunct Professorship in the Division of Palliative Care Medicine, at the University of Alberta.
