
Our Holy Week celebration has now come and gone. Many are tempted to end their engagement with the story right there. We see Jesus has been raised and everything is good. But is it?

Spring is here! It always feels like spring is a time to get busy and that's just what your Spiritual Gifts Committee (SGC) is doing. We're preparing for a new year that, for church leadership, kicks off on September 1st. It may appear that we've got plenty of time, but when you factor in all the steps required, we're getting busy just in time. You see, the SGC is responsible for creating an Annual Church Report that recommends folks to serve on committees, in church leadership roles, and in Sunday School (you can review the <u>current Church Report</u>). There are two church votes that have to be orchestrated which requires advance notice and opportunities for discussion. FBC's Constitution and Bylaws require the church to annually elect a Sunday School Director by the first Sunday of May. Next is the presentation of the Annual Church Report which presents the nominees for committees, committee chairs, and church leadership. The SGC has until the first Sunday in August to present this report to the church for a formal vote. Prior to all votes, the SGC works with the Senior Pastor and Church Moderator to announce each vote in advance and hold a discussion session to answer any questions. In all, each year the SGC nominates over fifty individuals to serve First Baptist Church. By the time you read this article the SGC will already be hard at work on this year's report.
