



Christ the Lord is Risen today, Alleluia! We are in the middle of the Lenten season, preparing our hearts and minds as we journey to the cross. Every year, I find myself overcome with emotion during Holy Week, as I am sure you do too. I am reminded of the depths of Christ's love for us. As a teenager, during Stations of the Cross, I saw clips from "The Passion of the Christ." I had never seen the movie before, and after seeing the clips, I wanted to view the rest of the movie. WASHCLOTHS so we can include 3 washcloths in


EACH Shoebox.

Spiritual Gifts Corner

Recently, Jeff preached about the challenge to being a Micah 6 church by living out the call "to act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8). How do we do this?
