Transitions

The Christian story begins in an animal stable where a baby boy was born to parents too poor, or too unprepared, to make better arrangements. The Christmas story repeats a theme seen throughout scripture—that God enters the world in surprising places and unexpected ways.

The month of Advent—four weeks leading up to Christmas Day—is a period of waiting, anticipating the birth of the Christ child. And it's a waiting period for children—making Christmas lists and then counting the days. And for adults—anticipating the family gatherings, the trips to see friends, it's a waiting period that moves too quickly, often disappearing before all the preparations have been made.

The idea of Advent in the Christian calendar, this idea of waiting, of anticipating, helps us understand Jesus' birth in the longer biblical story. The Jewish people had lived under the rule of occupying empires for hundreds of years. They longed to be free, to live under their own rulers. The prophets spoke of an anointed one, the Messiah, who would rescue the people. They waited. Generations waited. Jesus was the culmination of generations of prayer.

There are over 20 different scripture verses about waiting on the Lord. The prophet Isaiah said in the 40th chapter, “Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.”

Waiting on the Lord is not passive. We don't sit around until God does something. Waiting on the Lord is about naming what you are hoping for, praying for it, living in hope towards it, working for it—while also looking for the work of God's Spirit.

What are you waiting for? Expecting? Anticipating? Make time this Advent season to prepare for it. Merry Christmas!


A Huge Thank You


