

## THE WOMAN'S CLUB FALL PROGRAMS IMPRESS AND ILLUMINATE

This season's [Monday programs](#) have been a resounding success, bringing a memorable blend of style and substance to packed houses. From NPR's **Ari Shapiro**, who set the stage for a stellar lineup, to **Alex Hitz**, who set the table for a banquet of entertaining advice, members have been treated to the very best of gracious and thoughtful insights. The Program Committee, under the leadership of **Janet Nelson** and **Margaret Ivey**, has ensured that our audience of lifelong learners has had a weekly dose of diverse perspectives and stimulating information.

Journalist **Robin Wright** nimbly stepped in on October 16 for colleague **Martha Raddatz**, who was dispatched to the Mideast to cover the Israeli-Gaza war. Wright, a seasoned international correspondent, shared a clear and illuminating history of the conflict. Her sober and thoughtful viewpoint, honed by years of experience, helped the audience grapple with the complexities of a frightening world situation.

Three female Navy Top Gun pilots were the highlight of our October 9 program. They have balanced the incredible challenge of unusually demanding careers with being wives and mothers. And they remain committed to serving their country. They said, "there are a rainbow of people in the Navy. It is a great place to grow up and work. Come. Be with us. Join the jet community. It's been a wonderful ride." It was nothing short of an inspirational program.

Historian **Elisabeth Griffith** issued a clear call-to-action in her Nov. 6 talk: "I hope you will embrace American history as a way of using fact-based evidence to safeguard democracy." Griffith discussed her riveting 2022 book, "Formidable: American Women and the Fight for Equality, 1920 to 2020," which chronicles the century between the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment and the last presidential election. While women have made progress, much work remains.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE WOMAN'S CLUB PRESIDENT

Thirty years ago, Sandra Treadway – longtime member and recently retired Librarian of Virginia – wrote our club's history: Women of Mark. Today, an update could easily be “Remarkable Women.” The spirit of the handful of women who gathered some 130 years ago seeking “the delightful friction of well-trained minds” is alive and well today among our more than 1,200 members. The Program and Special Events committees see to that. The Library Committee, chaired by **Barbara Gibson**, entices us to continue learning with a thoughtful selection of books each week. Membership, led by **Kim Ruscio** and **Betty Walker**, seeks out new members with a thirst for knowledge. Hospitality, organized by **Caroline Lockerby**, encourages us to discuss ideas following the Monday speaker. And Scholarship, headed by **Barbara Glenn**, ensures we reach out and enable other women to share the love of learning.

The new year promises to continue this stellar trajectory. In 1900, **Mary Munford** and her fellow club organizers faced the challenge of buying the Bolling Haxall House, at a time when banks were reluctant to lend money to women. But they persevered. Today, we look forward to keeping our heritage home beautiful, safe, and up to date. We will embark on a campaign to renovate the auditorium and improve infrastructure ... a campaign led, like their predecessors, by talented and committed women.

It is a great time to be part of an organization that fosters learning, especially in such welcoming surroundings.

The Woman's Club of Richmond was part of the historical woman's club movement of the late 19th century, bringing members together in intellectual discourse at a time when they held few, if any, rights. Members of The Woman's Club are “just the kind of women whose company I enjoy – respectfully provocative,” said Griffith.

Award-winning journalist and author **Libby Copeland** spoke about her book, “The Lost Family: How DNA Testing is Upending Who We Are.” In her fascinating talk, she explored the rapidly evolving phenomenon of home DNA testing and its implications for how we think about family and identity. Blending her scientific knowledge with elements of a detective story, Copeland explained the rewards and perils, the pros and cons of searching for family lineage through today's popular home testing websites. The author traced the history of several families who

spit into a vial, found shocking results, and then were forced to wrestle with the huge questions: Who are we? What is family? Are we defined by nature, nurture, or both?

The charming, funny, and self-deprecating **David Baldacci** was the final speaker for the Fall programs. He told of growing up in a working-class family in Richmond and how he traveled the world through books. His love of reading inspired him to establish with his wife the “Wish You Well” foundation to encourage literacy and a passion for reading. “If all of us read more, we would have a better world,” Baldacci asserted. “Social ills would plummet... Reading allows us to realize our potential ... put food on the table and live in safety.”
