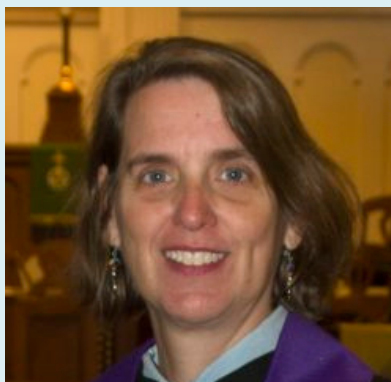

On Sunday, March 6, Rev. Martha D. Kears, D.Min. joins us as our guest proclaimer! Before moving to serve as the Senior Pastor at Peakland Baptist Church in Lynchburg, VA, Martha was a minister in the life of St. John's Baptist Church in 2001 as the Minister to Children and Family Life and was then installed as Associate Minister in February, 2012. Martha received her Master of Divinity in Pastoral Studies from the School of Divinity at Gardner-Webb University in 2007 and was

ordained by St. John's Baptist Church that same year. She received her Doctorate in Ministry at Gardner-Webb University in 2017.

She is the author of *The Sun Is Up: One Minister's Awakening to Racial Reconciliation*. Through the theology of hospitality, Kears describes how she came to understand her privilege as a white person, the racism built into many institutions—even sometimes in the church—and ways she can speak out against racism without speaking over marginalized voices. Martha and her husband Monty have three young adult children: Mattie, Conner, and Anna.

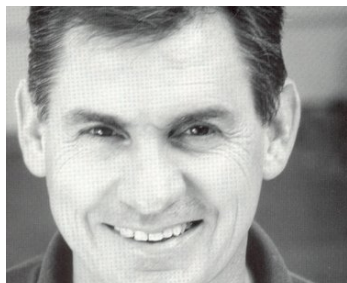

A View From the Underside: The Legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer

On the weekend of April 2-3, we welcome Al Staggs to St. John's! Al was a parish minister for over 20 years before starting a career as a performing artist. He has performed at Chautauqua Institution; Trinity Church, New York; the National Cathedral in Washington, DC; the International Arts Festival in Caux, Switzerland; Riverside Church, New York as

well as more than one hundred colleges and seminaries and hundreds of churches representing a wide diversity of denominational affiliation.

During the mid-1990's, Al began expanding his repertoire to include original interpretations of the lives of Clarence Jordan, Walter Rauschenbusch, Oscar Romero, Martin Luther, Roger Williams, Martin Luther King, Jr., Thomas Merton, William Sloane Coffin and William Stringfellow. On Saturday, April 2, he will present his dramatic, one-person performance entitled *A View From the Underside: The Legacy of Dietrich Bonhoeffer*. Tickets will be sold for this performance. On Sunday morning, April 3, Al will present a dramatic sermon representing Clarence Jordan, author of Cotton Patch Gospels and founder of Koinonia Farms, which was pivotal in the inspiration of Millard Fuller, founder of Habitat for Humanity.

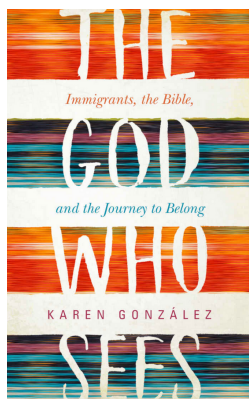

She wrote a book about her own immigration story and the many immigrants found in the Bible: *The God Who Sees: Immigrants, The Bible, and the Journey to Belong*.
