

CM202 Teaching Children Effectively Level 1

Course Syllabus for CMI Online

I. Course description

Teaching Children Effectively™ Level 1 is a course designed to equip local church members to reach children for Christ in various settings including Good News Clubs in the community and public schools as well as other children's classes. Attention is focused on the lostness of the child without Christ and the biblical basis for child evangelism.

Special emphasis is placed on methods of evangelism, such as The Wordless Book and the evangelistic Bible lesson. Students are also instructed in how to plan and conduct evangelistic children's classes in various venues. The course provides practical training, thus enabling students to immediately begin children's classes in their neighborhood or local school. Students are required to participate in five practical teaching opportunities with children in the context of a *Good News Club®/5-Day Club®*, applying the knowledge gained in the course.

II. Rationale

Jesus gave the command to "go and preach the gospel to every creature." However, subtle worldly philosophies have persuaded the majority of Christians that children cannot make a decision for Christ until they can "reason" or until they reach a certain age. It is generally accepted young children cannot receive Christ as their Savior and be born into the kingdom of God.

This course challenges the believer to reexamine biblical principles and teaching concerning child evangelism and confronts him with God's will that "not one of these little ones should perish" (Matthew 18:14). It exhorts the believer to lead the child to Christ as a first spiritual experience instead of continually attempting to give "spiritual food" to spiritually dead children (1 Corinthians 2:14).

Born-again Christian

Minimum age of 18 (for CMI Online course)

IV. Course Objectives

A. Cognitive objectives

The student will

1. Evaluate his concept of child evangelism based on principles clearly stated in the New Testament.
2. Have a clear understanding of the message of salvation in its most simple form and how to present it clearly to a child.
3. Recognize that in his role as a teacher of God's Word, he has certain privileges and responsibilities.

4. Acquire ability to analyze a Bible portion and to effectively present the message of salvation.
5. Have the ability to organize a neighborhood outreach ministry.

B. Affective objectives

The student will

1. Develop a deep appreciation for the ministry of child evangelism.
2. Be motivated to win children to Christ whenever the opportunity arises.
3. Desire to reach the child no one else is reaching for Christ through community or after-school Good News Clubs in public schools.

C. Performance objectives

The student will

1. Be evaluated by an approved proctor, implementing the methods taught within this course, for the following three practicums:
 - a. An 8-10 minute Bible memory verse, applying the principles and steps given in the course (Week 3).
 - b. A 12-15 minute presentation of the message of salvation on a child's level using *The Wordless Book* (Week 5).
 - c. Develop and present a 15-18 minute evangelistic Bible lesson for children with an invitation to receive Christ (present during Week 10).
2. Complete various homework assignments as required within the course.
3. Participate in five real-world teaching opportunities with children in the context of a *Good News Club®/5-Day Club®*, applying the knowledge gained in the course. The content of each teaching opportunity must be distinct (no repeated teaching, with the exception of *The Wordless Book*). Teaching of *The Wordless Book*, an evangelistic Memory Verse and an evangelistic Bible lesson must be taught in order to complete this course. The other two real-world teaching opportunities are your choice. *The Wordless Book* may be taught outside of a *Good News Club/5-Day Club* setting.
 - a. *The Wordless Book* or an evangelistic Memory Verse (week 6)
 - b. *The Wordless Book*, an evangelistic Memory Verse or an evangelistic Song (week 7)
 - c. *The Wordless Book*, an evangelistic Memory Verse, an evangelistic Song, or Prayer Time (week 8)
 - d. *The Wordless Book*, an evangelistic Memory Verse, an evangelistic Song, or Prayer Time (week 9)
 - e. Evangelistic Bible lesson (week 11)

V. Instructional procedures

Instruction delivered in video format will include lectures, class discussion, role playing, demonstration, small group activities and class discussion included in the class sessions

taught on campus at the *Children's Ministries Institute*®. Corrective learning opportunities will be offered through written homework assignments and evaluated practicum sessions. Forum discussions will provide an opportunity to interact with the course material on both a personal and interpersonal level. Real-world teaching assignments allow you to utilize newly gained skills as you teach children within the context of this course.

VI. Course materials

- A. *TCE* Level 1, Student Manual with *TCE* Level 1 Resource CD, evangelistic tract and a 60-Day Wonder Devotional Book
- B. Turned Around teaching kit that includes lesson text, flashcards, verse visuals (KJV or ESV), visualized songs (Just Turn Around, Let's Get Started, Children of God and Let Me Listen), Turned Around music CD, teaching cards, *The Wordless Book*, How to Lead a Child to Christ leaflet
- C. Supplementary materials as suggested within the course

VII. Participation policies

You can anticipate spending 10-12 hours per week on course activities and assignments. This includes time spent watching the videos that deliver the course content and completing assignments. Time spent completing proctor-evaluated practicums and real-world teaching assignments will vary.

It is expected that all assignments, including forum posts, be submitted on time. Failure to submit assignments on time will negatively affect your grade. In the case of an emergency or other extenuating circumstance, contact your online instructor before the assignment is due to make arrangements for a late submission of an assignment.

Participation in the forum discussions and live chats should be characterized by Christian courtesy. You may disagree with another student's (or instructor's) point of view, but please do so respectfully. Read the communication section of the student handbook for more details about forum, chat, and email expectations.

At the end of the first week, the course will be reviewed to determine if you are actively participating. If there is no evidence of participation, you will be dropped from the course roster. VIII. Grading policies and information

All students are encouraged to strive for excellence in every aspect of their training to bring honor to the Lord and to develop to their fullest potential. Therefore, all assignments must be presented on time and each assignment will be graded according to the evaluation criteria of the course.

Some assignments (worksheets, etc.) will be graded with a pass/fail grade. If the work is acceptable and completed on time, then a pass grade will be earned. If an assignment does not receive a passing grade, you will be given the opportunity to redo the assignment. All assignments earn points that determine the final course grade. All assignments **MUST BE COMPLETED** in order to pass the course.

It is expected that all assignments, including forum posts, be submitted on time. Failure to post forum items on time affects not only you but also your classmates and their learning. Therefore, late forum posts will negatively affect your grade. Please refer to the downloadable forum grading rubric included in the online Grading Policies and Information section of the course for information on how forums are evaluated.

Failure to submit any other assignment on time will also negatively affect your grade. In the case of an emergency or other extenuating circumstance, contact your online instructor before the assignment due date and make arrangements for a late submission.

All assignments must be posted or submitted by 11:55 PM Central Time of the day the assignment is due. In cases where the student consistently misses assignment due dates, the student may be withdrawn from the class without remuneration. The final grade for this course will be based on a 1,000 point scale. Each assignment is weighted based on the percentage of this total grade.

Week 1

This first week of TCE Level 1 will help you to be more aware of God's view of children and their need of salvation. Week 4

This week you will wrap up the teaching on How to Lead a Child to Christ and practice presenting *The Wordless Book* in preparation for your practicum next week. You may choose the evangelistic Bible lesson from the *Turned Around* lesson series that you will be developing to teach for your Bible Lesson Practicum, and begin to immerse yourself in that lesson. This is an exciting week of learning!

Week 5

This week you will dig deep into God's Word as you get to know a little about the characters that have an active role in your Bible lesson passage. You will also identify the locations where the activity took place, as well as the time in history. Make a list of the events that you see unfold within the passage. This Progression of Events will serve as the outline for your Bible lesson. For Assignment 3, you will answer questions that will help you determine the biblical principles that are observed in the passage. Then you will determine what one biblical principle stands out among the rest as the main biblical principle that was true for the original receivers of this narrative and is still true today. Ask God to guide you in this process.

You will also have the opportunity to present The Wordless Book to your proctor for evaluation this week! You are making significant progress! Keep up the good work!

Week 6

This week you will be completing your first Real-World Teaching Assignment! Be sure to pray that God will speak through you and your classmates. It will be exciting to hear how God answers prayer!

You will learn that the steps to teaching a song are the same as the steps for teaching a verse. Make plans to teach a song using the IPEAR method in an upcoming Real-World Teaching opportunity!

You will also be analyzing the Scripture passage for the evangelistic Bible lesson you are working to develop to determine where the message of salvation truths will be taught. Give yourself plenty of time to think through this step in preparing an evangelistic Bible lesson. You will also write an Introduction for your lesson. Don’t worry about linking the Introduction to the Progression of Events yet. That will come next week!

Week 7

This assignment will transform your Bible Story into a Bible Lesson that speaks to the hearts of the unsaved children. Determine how you will make your lesson flow smoothly by using links. Bible Lesson Assignment 5 is not due until Monday, but you will want to give yourself plenty of time to complete this assignment, so plan to get started on this assignment early in the week.

Next week you will have the opportunity to present the lesson to your proctor for evaluation. You will also have the opportunity to talk with your instructor and classmates in a live chat this week. Plan to bring any questions you might have about your upcoming practicum to the chat session. You have come a long way in this course! Keep up the good work!
