

South Hamilton Elementary School Receives \$4,000 Grant from the Dollar General Literacy Foundation to Support Youth Literacy

The Dollar General Literacy Foundation recently awarded South Hamilton a \$4,000 grant to support youth literacy.

The purpose of Project DARE (Dragons Achieve Reading Excellence) is to ensure that all students can read with the assistance of *Excellent* instructional materials. Project DARE is just one part of a school-wide incentive at South Hamilton Elementary School. On May 13, 2016, a school-wide Eric Carle Day was held and culminated with the painting of a South Hamilton Dragon. The dragon is hanging in the hallway and is the focus of our 1,000,000 minute reading incentive program, DARE to Read a Million Minutes, explained Mrs. Buhrman.

This grant will support Project DARE through the purchase of high quality, current guided reading books for 158 students in Kindergarten through second grade at South Hamilton. The purchase of quality guided reading materials will help enable the 158 students in kindergarten through second grade at South

Hamilton Elementary School.

This local grant is part of \$4.5 million in youth literacy grants awarded to approximately 1,000 organizations across the 43 states that Dollar General serves. Given at the beginning of the academic school year, these grants are aimed at supporting teachers, schools and organizations with resources to strengthen and enhance literacy instruction, according to Todd Vasos, Dollar General’s chief executive officer.
