WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

THE NEED

Alabama Childhood Food Solutions is a faith-based distribution center dedicated to providing food and hope to those in need across central Alabama. In our state:

- Over 750,000 people struggle with food insecurity
- 225,000 of them are children
- 1 in 4 children face the harsh reality of going to bed hungry without the support of ACFS

As the 5th poorest state in the nation, many of our neighbors are fighting a battle they cannot win without our support and solidarity.

THE SOLUTION

ACFS has four ministries to aid families and children:

- 1. **Backpack Program** We work with 38 schools and Boys & Girls Clubs to provide food bags to 2,553 children each week who have limited access to weekend meals and snacks in their homes.
- 2. Food Distribution Program Our family distribution model provides 70+ pounds of nutritious food monthly to over 1,200 families. We source from two major food banks and numerous local store partnerships to buy and rescue food for individuals living in underserved areas.
- 3. Doorstep Transports To assist over 170 families facing transportation or health challenges, we deliver food directly to their homes with help from churches, organizations, and volunteers.
- 4. **Satellite Distribution** We are duplicating our current distribution model in other communities across our footprint.

We have a proven model that works for each of these ministries and a team ready to respond to the growing need.

THE RESULTS

Highlights from ACFS in 2024:

- 75,438 children's food bags were sent home, marking a 30% increase from the previous year.
- Our distribution center has seen significant growth, serving 1,200 families by the end of 2024, up from 600 families in early 2022. This includes 200 families in the Lincoln area served through our satellite program.
- In 2024, we allocated 1.1 million pounds of groceries to those battling food insecurity.
- 900 volunteers contributed over 26,101 hours of service at ACFS.



COMMUNITY IMPACT

With the help of our donors, partners, and army of volunteers, ACFS has become the largest food distribution center in our area. We are helping the most vulnerable avoid having to make the choice between purchasing groceries or paying for other basic needs like medicine and utilities. We are rescuing quality food that unfortunately would have ended up at the landfill but instead we are getting it to people that cannot afford the food they need for their families. The number of individuals fighting food insecurity continues to rise. Alabama Childhood Food Solutions is standing in the gap ready to solve the hunger crisis in our state. ACFS is on a mission to offer "Hope" to each child and every family that so desperately needs a helping hand.








THE ACFS STORY A TIMELINE

The Alabama Childhood Food Solutions journey began in 2011 when **Jim and Linda Jones** returned home from one of many international medical mission trips they had participated in as nursing professionals. Both had witnessed hunger in every place they visited, and now God was revealing the struggles of families living right here in Central Alabama. They responded by providing food to those in need from the back of their truck. Below is a brief timeline of what happened next:



2711

Founders Jim and Linda Jones began distributing children's weekend food bags from the bed of their pickup truck.



2020

Increased from 2 family food distributions per month to 9.



2012

300 children received weekend food bags twice a month.



2022

Served 767 families per month.



2013

Rented space in Childersburg to house ACFS. ACFS implemented a family distribution model and served 600 families per month.



2023

Served 1,085 families per month and provided 1,500 weekend food bags.



2014

1,000 weekend food bags were distributed each week across three counties.



2024

Serving 1,200 families and providing 2,553 weekend food bags across 4 counties.



2015

Moved into our current location at 114 Canyon Ridge Road.



2025

Trusting God for continued growth and expansion as we provide food for the people who need it the most.

CURRENT ACFS MINISTRIES



The Backpack Program We provide over 2,500 children weekly with nutritious, easy-to-prepare food for weekends and school vacations through 38 schools and Boys & Girls Clubs, helping meet the needs of food-insecure children when other resources are unavailable.



Food Distribution Program At our drive-thru site, we provide essential food support with two boxes of fresh produce, non-perishables, meats, frozen goods, dairy, bread, sweets, and snacks, directly placing them in families' trunks for easy access to nutritious meals and groceries.



Doorstep Transports Each month, ACFS serves 1,200 families in need, but for 170 of them, getting to our distribution center in Sylacauga, AL, is a challenge due to health issues, lack of transportation, or our operating hours. To help, we launched Doorstep Transports—a lifeline for those in need. But we can't do it alone. We're seeking churches, organizations, and volunteers to help deliver food to these families.



Expanding Our Reach: ACFS's First Satellite Distribution We are expanding our satellite distribution in collaboration with Kingsville Corvette Club and Salem Missionary Baptist Church in Eastaboga, establishing ACFS's first satellite site serving 200 families. Every 1st and 3rd Thursday, food prepared in Sylacauga is delivered to the church and distributed to families in east-central Talladega and Calhoun Counties, following our successful Sylacauga model. This expansion helps us reach more families who may otherwise struggle to access food, ensuring no family goes hungry.


MAXIMIZING FOOD RESCUE

ACFS turns every dollar into \$5.74 worth of food, distributing food valued at \$2,633,465 annually. Through partnerships with Walmart, Publix, Sprouts, Chick-fil-A, Starbucks, and more, we rescue 91.8% of the food we distribute. In the U.S., 92 billion pounds of food—equivalent to 145 billion meals—are wasted each year, valued at \$473 billion. ACFS is committed to getting this food to families in need.
