Point In Time Homeless Count – Wednesday, January 22, 2020

What is Point In Time?

A Point in Time Count (PIT) is a one-day snapshot of the homeless populations in our community that captures the number and characteristics of people who are experiencing homelessness.

Knowing the number of people who are homeless and understanding the trends can help our community better understand the scope of the issue, improve system efficiency, strategically plan for resources and promote effective intervention.

The PIT count takes place across the nation. Wisconsin conducts this count twice per year; once in January and once in July.



How can you help?

- Participate in the overnight count. Volunteers are grouped together to cover designated parts of the county to help identify those who are homeless. Responsibilities include, driving, recording times and locations searched, and completing provided surveys with any person identified.
- Library Outreach the morning after the overnight count from 9-10:30 am - Volunteer to help at the resource table and to help any individual experiencing homelessness complete the survey.
- Donate requested basic need items that will be given to those identified during the count (like candy, granola bars, trail mix, canned tuna, canned soup, can openers, flashlights, zip lock bags, water, etc).
