- 1. Want to make a difference in a seniors life? Lakeland Health Care Center is looking for volunteers to help lead fun activities for the residents. Are you into fitness? Lead a chair exercise group,...are you into traveling? Do a travelogue. Are you into cards? Lead a card group. Do you enjoy reading the bible? Lead a small bible study. Do you have a well behaved dog? Bring them in for a visit. Do you like crafts? Lead a simple craft group. Do you like to bake? Lead a baking group. All supplies will be provided. You choose the day and time, could be every week or 2 times a month...very flexible. We would love to provide meaningful activities for residents. Volunteers need to be fully vaccinated and masks are required inside of building.
- 2. Volunteers are needed for a fun, new program called Connecting Minds that will take place on Thursday mornings at the Health and Human Services building. Volunteers are needed to assist staff with structured activities with clients with mild dementia.
- 3. Become a "Friendly Visitor" to a senior in need. Visit in person, help with such activities as paying bills, grocery shopping, or just be a friend to someone who lives alone or is isolated.
- 4. The senior dining center in Elkhorn is in need of a volunteer on Mondays from 10am to 12:30pm. Assist staff in serving lunch to seniors. A free lunch is also included.

Our social workers are having a train ing for foster care parents on Monday Feb 13th 6pm to 7:30pm at the Health and Human Services building at 1910 County Rd NN, Elkhorn. We are looking for 2 volunteers to help supervise the children during that training. Activities will be provided and staff will also be working along side with you.
