I offer a gracious invitation to you and all the children of St. Emily Parish to participate in our Children's Sunday Offertory Envelope Program.

I want to be clear that the purpose of this program *is not* to raise more money for the parish. The purpose is to teach the children the joy of giving and the fact that they need to give back to God out of gratitude for all that God has given to them.

Every St. Emily student enrolled in our Parish School as well as our Religious Education program will receive a box of Church envelopes to be used at Sunday Mass for the entire year. The envelopes will allow the children to write down a gift of time to prayer or

talent in service to others that they have shared that week.

Each week, during the Preparation of Gifts at Sunday Mass, children will be invited to place

their envelope in the collection baskets that are passed throughout the Church on

Sundays.

I ask you to support the effort by first and foremost bringing your child to Sunday Mass

each week. Please remind them to bring their envelopes with them and talk with them

through the week regarding their thoughts and feelings about Stewardship of Prayer,

Service and Sacrificial Giving.

I do not expect you to supply your child with the money that goes in the envelope. One

of the primary purposes of this effort is to teach children that it does indeed feel good to

give. It is good to know that we have something to offer back to God, the Church and the

world. For this reason, it is more important that a child puts in a nickel, dime, or quarter

from his or her allowance and feels proud of that contribution rather than putting money in

the envelope given to them by mom or dad.

Sunday Mass each week.
