

BUILDINGS & GROUNDS MEETING

October 8, 2024

1. Signs-at the request of office manager (having to direct persons to meetings) Stokes signs will replace the small parish hall sign with a “Fireside Room” sign and move the current sign to the Cedar St. side of the parish hall.
Stokes will also begin design of permanent Calvary Episcopal Church signs for the north and south sides of the church. These signs will advertise service times, rector and special events/liturgical changes. We hope to have these signs ready by December or January.
2. Labyrinth development proceeding as planned. A fence will be erected around the north side of the church beginning Oct. 15th with heavy equipment and workers beginning to dig up old, useless sprinkler pipes and install gopher wire over the entire area. Lars will arrive Oct 23rd to begin layout of labyrinth. Martha suggested an informal potluck to welcome Lars. She suggested her home for this small event of Labriynth committee members and Vestry. Official community work day will be Oct. 26th Martha will supply liability releases for non-church members and the photographer will supply releases for photos to possibly be published.

A parish celebration for this accomplishment will be Dec 1st. A community celebration will be planned for February or March with invitations sent to City officials and the Bishop.

Michael Freeman volunteered to finish the fir tree slab for the memorial plaques to be incorporated into the garden. Committee approved as Michael is an accomplished woodworker.

Francisco is busy for the next 2 months or so. Chris will contact him to schedule his building of the bench to surround the pepper tree. This will work well with the approximate completion of the garden planting by Terra Nova.

3. Committee approved purchase of a vest for Edgar with Calvary Church clearly advertising him as an employee of the church. As his hours are mostly at night we hope this will encourage interlopers of the parking lot to be more respectful. Carol will pursue purchase.
4. A vandal smashed a stained glass window in the Narthex. Leeann called the police and wisely agreed to press charges. Chris will pursue with insurance company. Susan Wagner, our stained glass repair person, has inspected and is forwarding a bid for approximately \$600 to repair.
