Mission Appeal: Maryknoll Lay Missioners

Dear Friends in Christ:

Every year, like the other parishes of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, we get the opportunity to participate in the Missionary Cooperative Program by which our parish can support the Mission of the Church beyond the Archdiocese and even our country. While most of us are not called to serve as missionaries in foreign countries, by our prayers and financial support, we can support the effort of those men and women who do answer the call to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20)

This year, we welcome Mr. Sonny Nguyen on behalf of the Maryknoll Lay Missioners. Sonny will be speaking before all Masses this weekend to share about the work of the Maryknoll Lay Missioners and what they are able to accomplish with our support.

In this space, I wish to share some words from the Maryknoll Lay Missioners in advance of their appeal:

Sonny Nguyen and his wife Hong joined Maryknoll Lay Missioners in 2015 and were sent to serve in Cochabamba, Bolivia. As lay missioners, they focused their work on education and pastoral care of the abandoned, abused, orphaned children with learning disabilities and the incarcerated and paroled women. Thanks to their experience, skills and efforts, Sonny and Hong were affecting the lives of many children and women in Cochabamba- Bolivia. Sonny and Hong say frequently what Mother Teresa used to say, "Not all of us can do great things, but we all can do small things with great love". Currently, Sonny is the US Church Relations Officer for Maryknoll Lay Missioners.

Sonny will speak at all masses at Sacred Heart Co-Cathedral during the weekend of September 18-19, 2021 to share his mission experience as part of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston's Missionary Co-

operation Plan 2021. The second collection will be taken to support Maryknoll Lay Missioners. Your kind welcome and generous support is most appreciated.
