

GUIDELINES FOR RESPECTFUL CONVERSATIONS

Especially for Discernment for Elected Office

As a delegate to the General Chapter, engaged in communal discernment for election, I commit to the following guidelines as we discuss persons to be considered for election. I promise:

- 1. To focus on sisters' strengths and gifts rather than on their personal limitations.
- 2. To share a concern or a reservation about a sister ONLY if <u>at least one</u> of the following applies:
 - a. The sister herself has publically shared the information about herself in writing or speaking.
 - b. The information raised is something already generally known (e.g., ministry, residence, education, profession group).
 - c. I have spoken directly with the sister herself about my concern. **Note**: Even if this has happened, it is still critical to consider the implications of sharing concerns about another with additional persons.
 - i. Will this damage the individual's reputation?
 - ii. Will this contribute positively to the communal discernment process?
 - d. There is a serious reason a sister should not be considered to be voted upon and she will not withdraw her name voluntarily, then present your concern to the president of the Chapter.
- 3. To recognize that hearsay, gossip and second-hand information have no place in communal discernment and are, in fact, toxic to the process.
- 4. To acknowledge that I can only speak for myself: "I am concerned..." rather than "I heard someone else say..." or "Someone who knows her said..."
- 5. To refrain from interpreting another's silence to mean either agreement or disagreement. Everyone has a right to refrain from saying something about a person being discussed.
- 6. To recognize that political behaviors such as caucusing, campaigning, electioneering or trying to manipulate a process are not compatible with communal discernment. In fact these behaviors are toxic to the process
- 7. To follow these guidelines both in formal community conversations as well as in smaller, informal and individual conversations.
