- **3 Non-QEW Refresher classes** (FacOps, SRWC, Mail & Packaging, School of Medicine Researchers) with 82 attendees.
- **44 individual Hands-On Demonstrations sessions**
- **3 Training Locations:** 203 Learning Center, 134 & 135 Einstein Conference Room, High Volt Shop
- **3 Hands-On Demonstration Locations:** District A, District C, T676
- **Lunch and breakfast for 94 attendees**
