▶ NCJW IS SERVING OUR COMMUNITY!

Oh my goodness, so much happening! Here are some short 'catch-up's' on what we've been doing! Funds from our Homeless Assistance Fund bought much-needed tarps for our ever-growing homeless population. About a third of the newly homeless are seniors, unable to meet the rising costs of rent, food and medical needs. Many are older women who find themselves without husbands or families.

Our cooking skills are coming in handy! Our Co-VP of Advocacy, Chana Ham-Rosebrock, (one of our favorite chefs) stepped up to make a huge batch of chili and beans for the 35 women and children at Lydia House (the women's part of LB Rescue Mission), which suffered a fire on Christmas Eve. Quite a bit of damage was done (including the kitchen), so the residents had to move to a temporary location with no place to cook. We were the first community group to respond, and we took 2 huge pots of chili and 40 pieces of cornbread (baked by yours truly, Marie Callendar's package of course!) We had a wonderful time visiting with the women and letting them know they were cared about. Those women lost everything. Our Community Service volunteers mobilized to replace some of what was lost — clothing, blankets, shoes, etc. They still need stuff, so let us know if you've got something to donate.



Warm clothing is needed desperately, and the men of course are still in need as well. The need for cooked meals for 35 will continue until the repairs are done. If you're interested, let us know!

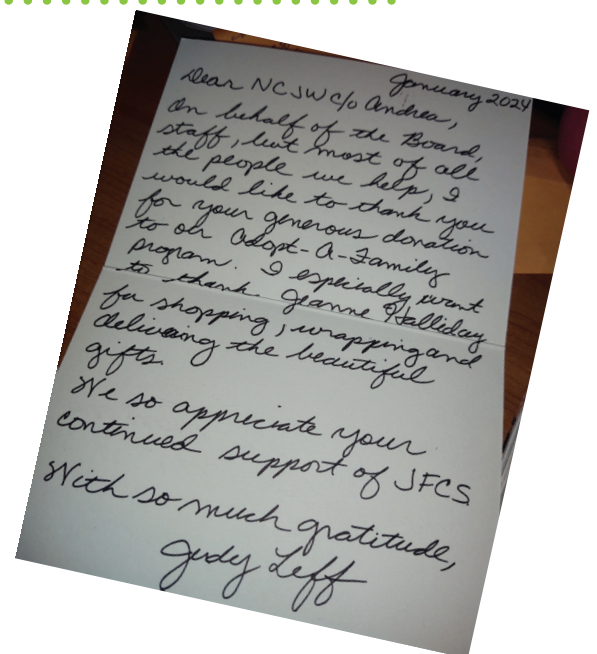
Our Tikkun Olam Fund enables us to adopt a family for the holidays through Jewish Family and Children's Service. This year, JFCS gave us our own Afghan family, who just had a brand-new little baby! We were able to purchase some sorely needed things, and our Advocacy folks threw them a baby shower as well. Our community service connections in the community gave us several packs of size 0 diapers (which are expensive!), so that was great. The family members are all fine, happy, and living in a small room and looking for jobs. If you have baby things or household goods to donate, please contact us and we'll make arrangements.

The next Abortion Comfort Kit packing is Tuesday, March 5th. We'll be packing about 300 kits and having our own Sherri Sobel (our favorite Juvenile Court Referee) tell her personal abortion story for our next Courageous Conversation. 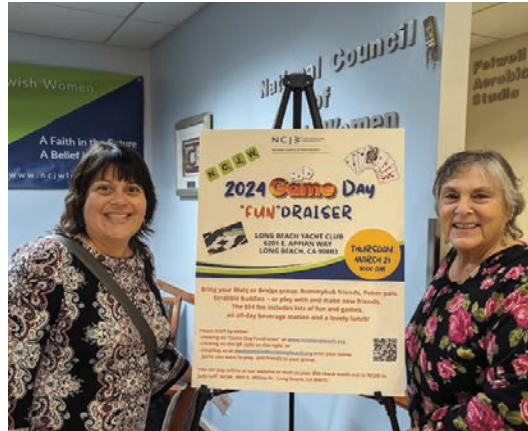
