

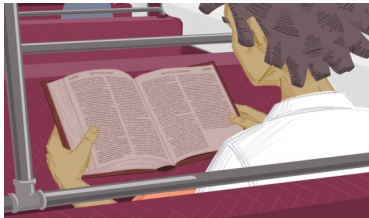
Adult Education Upcoming Classes

Racists Anonymous Informational Session Thursday, Oct. 8; Sessions Begin on Thursday, Oct. 15

Our church, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), is clear that racism is a sin against humanity. Viktor E. Frankl, author of *Man's Search for Meaning*, has something to say to those of us who are feeling helpless to change the injustice and racism wreaking havoc in our world: “When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves.”

We are given an opportunity to do just that. Covenant is offering a chance to address the sin of racism as a personal addiction through a Racists Anonymous (RA) educational session based on the AA 12-step program. RA is a fellowship of individuals seeking to achieve personal recovery from racist habits and the effects of racism. Its purpose is to help individuals address their own role in the sin and addiction of racism.

This 12-week session will be offered virtually on Thursday evenings from 7-8 pm. Participants are encouraged to participate in all or most of the sessions. For anonymity and security, Pastor Jeff Fox-Kline will send a Zoom link to those who email him at jfoxkline@covenantmadison.org.

How COVID-19 Affected One Covenant Mission in Guatemala

Fifteen years ago, Covenant brought 12-year-old Jorge Ascención to Madison from Guatemala for a kidney transplant at University Hospital. Covenant provides his daily anti-rejection medications. We normally deliver them annually through our mission team or through Presbyterian mission co-workers. Of course, COVID has complicated that this year.

Over the last four months, Nancy Gunder and Sally Lorenz faced many roadblocks as they rushed to get Jorge his meds before he was due to run out at the end of September. Finally, after immense research and language hurdles, all pieces of the puzzle came together and we shipped the first three-month supply on August 25. Miraculously, it was delivered to Jorge at his home in Santo Domingo just 4 days later. Jorge called Nancy, overjoyed that the meds had arrived safely.

A supply package will be sent to Jorge via DHL every three months over the next nine months. We very much hope and pray for a vaccine so that Covenant can send a group to Guatemala soon!

“All the Ends”

 Inspired by Isaiah 52:7-10

Artist Reflection:

“All the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of God” (Is. 52:10). After reading that line, an image of water meeting land emerged in my mind. While this passage opens with visuals of the mountains, I found myself sketching a composition that places the viewer in the current, peering over the waves to the shoreline in the distance.

In this section of the Book of Isaiah, the prophet composes a vision of promise and peace for the people of Israel, one that seems to be materializing before their very eyes. But these words were proclaimed from the ruins of exile. Restoration was not yet a reality. They were still stuck in the deep—in the pain, in the suffering, in the waiting for a better world. We read these words some 2,500 years later on the other side of this promise fulfilled. We receive this vision with assurance that the messenger of peace yet again brings comfort and restoration to our battered world.

In this painting, the focal point is the swoop of current along the bottom. No matter what your life feels like right now, whether you feel stuck in the deep or swept up in the current, may you be buoyed by the promise that all the ends of the earth, all the edges of your life, are wrapped in God's care.
