A. 4-H Grows Profit

Do you have a handcrafted item that could be turned into a sellable product? Wondering how to calculate your cost and determine a good selling price for your item? This session will cover the basics of break-even cost for production and packaging. It will also explore how to conduct a focus group to determine your pricing strategy and make the most profit from your target audience.

B. 4-H Grows Creative Thinkers

Join the ongoing debate that explores the connection between the Creative Arts and Science. Brainstorm, discuss and debate the science within a number of creative art areas. Participants will have the opportunity to decide for themselves whether science is art or art is science.

C. Fabric collage

Materials: An 8 X 10 piece of mounting board in a color and a pair of tweezers. If you have fabric that has a realistic small scene or animal, bring it too.

Use half inch squares of fabric and longer tree shapes to make a picture you can later frame under glass. Small squares and tree shapes will be provided. Learn perspective, blending techniques in this no-sew project.



D. Glass Etching

Materials: Supplied

Create a beautiful etched glass mirror with a design of your choice. After attending this workshop, you will be able to conduct a glass etching workshop in your county. Participants need to bring a design no bigger than 10" X 10" to be transferred on a mirror. Simple designs like sports team logos, with not much detail are the best to use for their first glass etching project.



E. Fashion Storyboard

Materials: Supplied

Be a fashion creator. Anyone can learn how to put your clothing ideas down on paper like a designer. You will use fashion figures and learn how to "dress" the figure with your own designs in black fine line marker, including the creation of a complete storyboard.



F. Fabric Crate Liner

Materials: Crate, sewing machine (If possible), thread, pins, scissors, (rotary cutter, mat, ruler optional), fabric.

Spice up an old or new wooden crate with a fabric liner. You need to provide your own crate, sewing machine (If possible), thread, pins, scissors, (rotary cutter, mat, ruler optional), fabric. To determine amount of fabric needed, measure side, bottom, side, plus 8 inches for both width and length. For example, 11W x 14L x 6D crate, $6+11+6+8=31$ for width, $6+14+6+8=34$ for length. You would need a piece of fabric 31 inches by 34 inches.



G. T-Shirt Quilt/Pillow Case

Materials: Please bring 4 to 5 t-shirts and 2 yards fabric that coordinates with the t-shirts and 1 yard to coordinate with the fabric, 2 yards light weight Pelon, sewing supplies.

Beginner to intermediate you will learn how to take a t-shirt and make it into a quilt/pillow case.



H. Cupcakes Galore

Materials: Supplied

Learn some basic cake decorating skills while decorating cupcakes and creating a Thanksgiving display to be enjoyed by all. The cupcakes will be dessert for all the participants Saturday evening



I. My Time

You know your schedule and your needs. If you need time to prepare for your session, if you think you might need additional time to complete a project from another session or know you will need some alone time select this session. * After the first session time there will be a room set up for projects that will need to be finished. **There will be time on Saturday evening to finish projects.**

J. Easy Sew Skirt

Materials: Bring fabric and notions for the skirt style you select A or B. Link to pattern back for materials

New to sewing? This class is designed to help you become comfortable with both a sewing machine and serger. It will also teach you pattern layout, cutting, essential construction skills and finishing techniques as you learn to create an applied elastic casing, pull-on Simplicity skirt - style A or B only. **This Project WILL take more time to finish. So we STRONGLY recommend that you sign up for My Time during the 7:30-9:00 session Saturday night in order to finish your skirt.**



K. Flooding Cookies

Materials: bring a cookie sheet or box to transport wet cookies.

Basic beginner class, participants will learn on how to outline and flood cookies with Royal Icing. After the cookie is outlined, a thinner version of the same icing is used to fill the outlined area. This is called FLOOD icing. It will usually flow until it fills the entire cookie.



L. String Art

Materials: Participants will need to bring a small hammer to class. A pair of needle nose pliers may be handy for hanging on to the nails.

Participants will learn how to make a simple string art project choosing from at least 2 different patterns.



M. Intro to Felting

Materials:

Learn the basics of the world of felting. You will be introduced to both wet felting and needle felting with felted soap and felted pumpkin projects.



N. Line Dancing

Materials: None

Have you ever wanted to learn line dancing or just burn off some energy before dinner? This session is for you join other participants and have a great time share music and movement.



O. Pour Painting

Materials: Supplied

Have you always wanted to be an artist and display your own art work but lacked the skills. Here is your answer, Pour paint are beautiful abstract designs, each unique using colors you select.

Q. Beginning Crocheting

Materials: Crochet hook if possible.

Learn the basics of crocheting. Explore a variety of crochet stitches and styles in this session.



R. Santa Dec Mesh Wreath

Materials: Kit will be provided.

Make a Santa deco mesh wreath.



S. 1940's Felt Flower Corsage Brooch

Materials: Participants should bring a pen; scissors both fabric (smaller to make little cuts, you may want a regular pair also to cut out the bigger pieces) and paper; hand sewing needle; pins.

Learn to make a 1940's Felt Flower Corsage Brooch and other felt flowers.



T. Soup Bowl Cozies

Materials: For each bowl you will need two 10" square pieces of **100% cotton fabric**, scissors, rotary cutter and mat, washable pen or pencil, **100% cotton thread**, sewing machine, ruler, walking foot (optional).

These bowl-shaped pot holders are the perfect thing to stack next to the microwave/stove to prevent burns and spills when handling hot bowls. Basic sewing knowledge/experience required.



U. Bath and Body Works

Materials: Supplied

Learn how to make body scrubs, lip balms and bath salts in this hands-on class about hand-made skincare products. This class will discuss safe practices for making bath products as well as other helpful tips for getting started. Participants will make products and take home a packet of recipes. Perfect for beginners! All supplies will be provided.



V. Paper Crafts

Materials: Supplies

Learn how to do a variety of paper crafts from basic Origami to paper beads. All supplies will be provided.

X. Beginning Knitting

Materials: Knitting needles if possible.

Learn the basics of knitting. Explore a variety of stitches and styles during this session.



Y. Fun Little Basket

Materials: Supplied

Learn the very basics of basket weaving including recognizing the right and wrong side of the reed and twining and make your own unique small basket with round and flat reeds. These baskets are simple design without handles or complicated patterns.

Z. Magic Pillow Case

Materials: Supplied

INTERMEDIATE....must be familiar with sewing machine and tools used. We will make a pillowcase using three different cotton fabrics.



AA. Quick and Easy

Materials: Bring a book and a glass candlestick holder

Learn how to do a variety of fun, quick and easy activities. These activities

BB. Project Runway

Materials: Supplied

Ever wonder what it would be like to be a part of the TV Show, Project Runway? Here is your chance to create an accessory or garment with no previous experience required. Participants can work on their own or as part of a team. Each will be given a chance to define their design idea and then pick materials to make it. Bring your creativity and any recyclable items you would like to use for the design. Materials will also be provided for use. The class will end with a lesson in posing and modeling for a runway show featuring the created designs.



CC. T-Shirt to Treasure

Materials: Old T-shirts, Rotary cutter and mat or exacto knife.

This session will allow participants to reuse their old t-shirts to make a nice heavy yarn that can be used to make hot pads or other items needing a heavy yarn. They will also learn several other ways to reuse their shirts to make Pillows, shopping bags, cat habitats and designer shirts.

DD. Dyeing with Plants

Materials: Participants may bring a small amount of their own fiber (yarn, roving, or small pieces of 100% natural material cloth) to dye in exhaust baths.

Geared toward beginners, participants in this session will learn about



natural dyes, including which plants produce dyes, properties of a good dye, and how to mordant or "fix" your fiber. Find out how to get color out of plants in your backyard or even the grocery store! Participants will have the opportunity to try dyeing silk scarves and learn various shibori (or tie-dye) techniques.
