KINSHIP PERMANENCY INCENTIVE (KPI)

THE SUMMER CRISIS PROGRAM

Began July 1 and goes through Sept. 30, 2020. The program helps income-eligible Summit County residents maintain their utility service by paying an electric bill, purchasing an air conditioning unit or up to two (2) fans, or paying for central air conditioning repairs.
