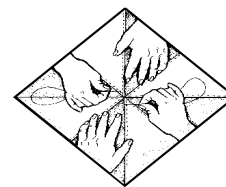
Congratulations to the above young people who will be confirmed on June 2. A special welcome to full activity in the life of St. John's Lutheran Church.

SEWING GROUP



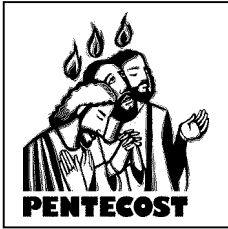

BREAKFAST BUNCH



It is after much prayer, reflection, and consternation that after nine years of coordinating the Breakfast Bunch, I must now step away.

This is not to say, that I will not be available to the person or people who hopefully will take on the coordination of this vital community outreach program, but rather it is just time to pass on what I pray will be a feeding program that will continue, here at St. John's, for many years to come.

I must say, that from its very beginning, the Breakfast Bunch has blessed me far more than I have blessed others. The number of people from our church, other local churches, and community members who have volunteered to support the Breakfast Bunch with their time, talents, and donations has surpassed my wildest imagination. God has truly been at work in the Breakfast Bunch!

The Breakfast Bunch began in 2009 with a two-week trial run. It worked, and so the next year, the summer feeding program was expanded to four weeks. After that, the Breakfast Bunch was up and running, and the only thing to do was to expand it again, and this time to eight to nine weeks of the summer. To fund the program, individuals, churches, the Northern Lehigh Pastoral Association, and local organizations have generously given and grants were applied for and received. This funding still continues today! Praise be to God!

Coming forth from the Breakfast Bunch have been two additional feeding programs. The first began about three and a half years ago, and again, with many distinguished volunteers the free Community Luncheons were launched. With the delicious talents of chefs Brian and Debbie Geiger, food has been served to as many as 153 people on Sunday afternoons. Then, just this past summer, and still continuing, a weekend food "backpack" program began. Each week local children come to our church and are given

a large bag of easy-to-heat/or no heat foods for the weekend.

We are and have been, for many, many years before I came to Slatington, a thriving church, reaching out into the community to show the love of God and our Lord and Savior. So, please pray and listen, and you just might hear God calling you as he called me nine years ago.

After writing all of this to you, my brothers and sisters in Christ, I pray that one or more than one of you will hear a call from God to continue the Breakfast Bunch in 2019!

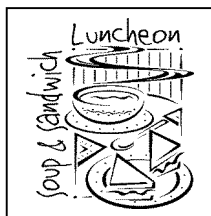

The Catering Committee is sponsoring a soup and sandwich sale on Saturday, August 3. Orders are due on Sunday, July 28. Pick-up times will be between 9:00 and 11:00 A.M. on Saturday, August 3, in the Fellowship Hall. The menu is: (Take Out Only)

- o *Chicken Salad with Cranberries & Pecan Sandwich* – Diced tender chunks of cooked chicken breast, diced celery, diced onions, dried cranberries, chopped pecans, mayo, and pepper mixed and put on a roll with lettuce and tomatoes. Price – \$5.50 each.
- o *Cold Meatloaf Sandwich* – Sliced homemade meatloaf is placed between two slices of Italian bread along with ketchup, mustard, and mayo packs. Price – \$5.50 each.
- o *Hearty Beef Barley Soup* – A blend of diced celery, diced onions, shredded carrots sautéed in butter. Blend with hearty roast beef broth and diced chunks of beef along with corn, peas, green beans, lima beans, diced cabbage, diced tomatoes and barley. Season with black pepper, parsley, and Worcestershire sauce. Price – \$6.00 per quart.
- o *Jambalaya Soup* – Diced onions, diced green bell peppers, diced celery, sautéed with chunks of chicken, smoked sausage, country sausage, shrimp, and garlic. Add chicken broth, diced tomatoes, tomato sauce, and long grain rice. Price -- \$7.00 per quart.
- o *Old Fashioned Chicken Rice Soup* – A blend of diced celery, diced onions, shredded carrots sautéed in butter. Blend with chicken broth, diced tender chunks of chicken, long grain white rice. Season with black pepper and parsley for a delicious chicken rice soup. Price – \$6.00 per quart.

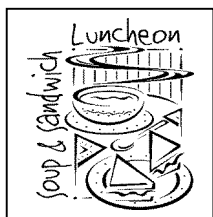

o *Ham and Cheese Club on Kaiser Roll* – Thinly sliced baked ham with American cheese, crispy bacon, and sliced tomatoes on a Kaiser roll with mayo and mustard packet. Price – \$5.50 each.

o *Chicken Bow Tie Soup* – A mixture of diced celery, diced onions, and shredded carrots sautéed in butter. Blend in a hearty chicken stock. Add tender chunks of chicken,

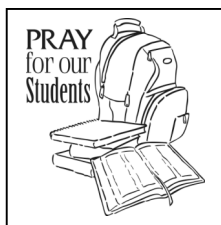

MASTER CALENDAR OF EVENTS

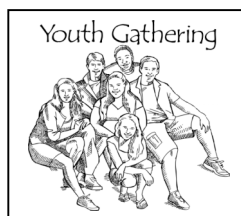


A master calendar of all events held on the church premises is retained in the church office to avoid double booking the

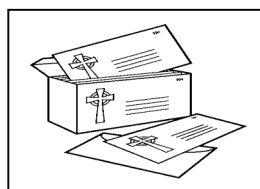
YOUTH GATHERING COMMITTEE

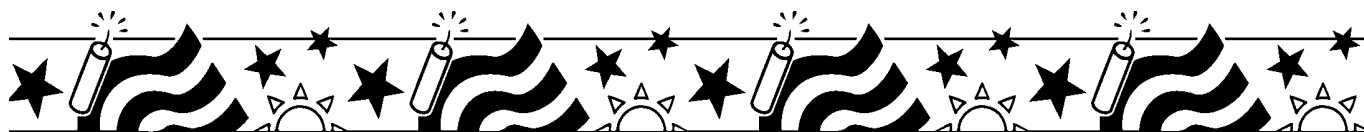

Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

Saturday Evening at Zion, Tamaqua



One size does not fit all, especially when it comes to worship styles. Five years ago Zion, Tamaqua developed a Saturday evening service to

- provide an alternative time of worship for people who cannot get to a Sunday service, and
- provide an alternative style of worship for people who do not relate to the typical traditional high liturgy.

The service includes all the parts of a traditional service but in a more relaxed, informal style. Within a short period of time, we installed a digital projector and purchased the ProPresenter program to organize our worship and to allow us to add purchased music and subject matter videos to our service.

Because of its flexibility, the Saturday service has been adapted to include a special service for cancer survivors, our annual blessing of the animals, a vow renewal service around Valentine's Day, and a Christmas in July service complete with a full holiday dinner following the service. All the Saturday services begin with Godsightings, when people are encouraged to share where they have seen God at work in their lives during the past week.

In December 2017 we began live-streaming our Saturday and Sunday services through Boxcast. As of March 30, we have webcast 107 services. On our website we've reached 379 unique viewers who watched 1,491 times. We began posting on Facebook in March 2018. Since then we've had 2,522 viewers of Saturday services and 2,830 viewers of Sunday services. Services are archived for several weeks.

A simple breakfast became an example of hospitality in downtown Easton at its best!



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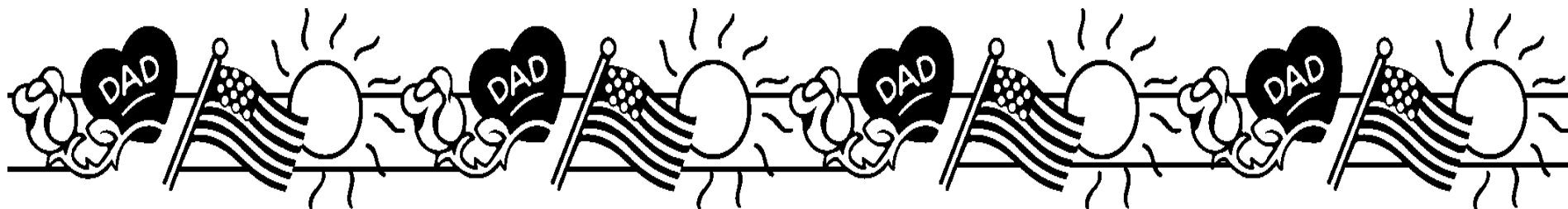
