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Dear Friends in Christ,

In late June I announced that I would be retiring at the end of the Summer. My last Sunday to lead you in worship will be September 1. I am truly thankful to God for the chance to have been your pastor for these last 19 years. We have celebrated happy times and sad times together; both our joys and sorrows in our lives of faith.

With the Congregation Council's acceptance of my retirement and the completion of my final duties in this congregation, my pastoral relationship with the members of Saint John's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Slatington, Pennsylvania officially comes to an end on October 1, 2019. I will be using the month of September as vacation time for Brittany's wedding and to affect our move to Cherry Hill, New Jersey. I treasure the privilege you have given me to serve as your pastor for 19 years, but now pastoral responsibilities performed at your request and on your behalf will belong to your interim/designated pastor and then to your next regularly called pastor.

While friendships established during my pastorate can and will continue, it will be no longer appropriate for me to perform any pastoral functions (baptisms, weddings, funerals, etc.) for the members of Saint John's. If you ask

me to perform or assist at a pastoral function, I will have to say "No." And my negative answer comes from my respect for the integrity of the congregation, for the ministry of the pastors who will be serving you, for the professional ethics of the vocation I love, and for the policies of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Only in extraordinary circumstances and with the prior approval of the synodical bishop and the Congregation Council would I consider accepting such an invitation.

My sincere request to you—as former parishioners and future friends—is to honor my determination to maintain healthy boundaries and to keep a respectful pastoral distance from the congregation. Please, therefore, do not ask me or request your pastor to invite me to functions as a pastor on your behalf. I would, however, consider it an honor to be invited to weddings, baptisms, funerals, and other functions as a friend and look forward to celebrating those rites of passage with you as my schedule allows. When in doubt about any request, please check with your regularly called pastor, or the Office of the Bishop.

COMMUNITY LUNCHEONS ARE BACK!



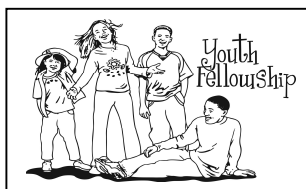

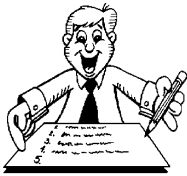
The Jubilees will sponsor the first coffee hour on Sunday, October 6.

To sponsor bulletins or flowers for any open date, sign your name on the appropriate chart posted on the bulletin board outside the church office or call the office at 610-767-6361.

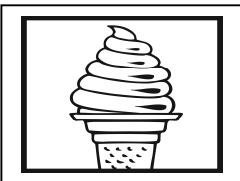
SECOND CHANCE SHOPPE

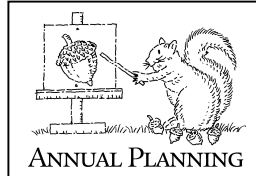

The Northern Lehigh Food Bank is collecting school supplies for children in need.

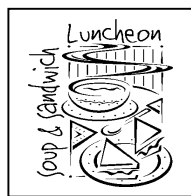
Some of the supplies

HARVEST HOME SCHEDULED

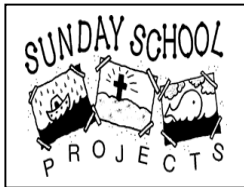


Our annual Harvest Home celebration is scheduled for Sunday, September 29, at both services.

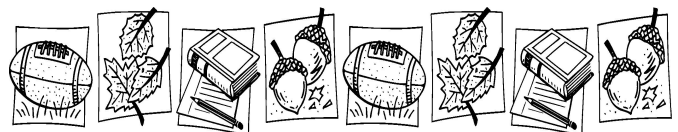

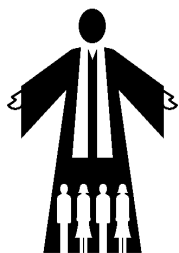
CHURCH EQUIPMENT SIGN-OUTS

2019 SYNOD ASSEMBLY



Pastor Haab and I (Sharon Stehly), attended the Mission District Assembly on Thursday, May 16, at Grace Lutheran Church in Belfast. Stephen Stehly, along with Pastor Haab and Sharon attended the 32nd Annual Northeast PA Synod Assembly on Saturday, June 1 at Genetti's in Hazleton. Everyone should attend at least one Synod Assembly in their lifetime. It is an exciting gathering of pastors, deacons, and lay people.

The day began with Festival worship led by Bishop Zeiser. An offering of \$3,600 was collected for World Hunger. Our theme was "Freed in Christ for a New Day" which reminds us it is a new day and that who got us here will come again.

The ELCA churchwide representative, Rev. Ronald Glusenkamp spoke on the ELCA Churchwide ministry. An offering of \$3,300 for the Campaign for the ELCA was collected.

Bishop Zeiser reviewed some of the ministry and mission for the NE PA Synod and the challenges that the next bishop to be elected in 2020 will face. Congregations are also facing challenging situations.

After lunch, there were several elections and reports from other synod officers. The assembly adopted two resolutions. One to bring the synod council up to date with current practice. The other was a resolution that the Youth, Young Adult, and Family Ministry Team work with the Transition Team to address the need for synodical youth leadership and many volunteer opportunities. The 2020 assembly will elect a Bishop from June 4-6 at the Kalahari Resort in the Poconos.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to represent our church at the synod assembly. It is always a wonderful and inspiring experience.
