Step 1: Hoop No Show Stabilizer in your largest hoop. Lay a piece of Fusible Fleece with the fusible side facing up. Stitch then trim excess fleece close to the stitching.

Step 2: Lay a piece of white fabric over your egg and straight stitch. Don't use your pretty fabric because this is going to be completely covered up.

Step 3: Stitch the placement lines for the pink and lilac appliques.

Step 4: Place a piece of pink fabric over the top area, and a piece of lilac fabric over the bottom area. Stitch in place. Trim excess inside the egg, but leave at least a ½" seam allowance along the outer edge.

Step 5: Stitch the placement lines for the lt.blue and yellow sections.

Step 6: Place a piece of yellow fabric covering the top section and a piece of yellow fabric over the other. Stitch in place. Trim excess inside the egg, but leave at least a ½" seam allowance along the outer edge.

Step 7: Fancy Fill with lt. Blue thread

Step 8: Fancy Fill with pink thread

Step 9: Fancy Fill with yellow thread

Step 10: Fancy Fill with purple thread

Steps 11 - 13: Stitch the satin stitch

Step 14: Fold two pieces of 12" x 15" fabric in half lengthwise. Position with the fold at the center overlapping by at least ½". Sew the outer egg with a

straight stitch.
