 - Expanded unemployment benefits during the holidays will be required
 - Another \$1,200 stimulus check would be appropriate for the President to try to influence any remaining independent / undecided voters
 - If we get a State or major County bankruptcy filing, the stimulus legislation will be negotiated and signed within seven days
- 7) Managed Care, CCOs, SIP-PLs – Are We There Yet?
- 8) The New York State Medicaid Program, As Both Eliot Spitzer and George Pataki Predicted, Is Unsustainable! – 7.5 Million Medicaid Eligibles, Increasing Each Month and Blowing Through a \$75-80 Billion Budget Projection – Major Cuts Are Inevitable
 - I thought the Governor’s 20% withhold on State contracts was egregious
 - Now, I think we might look back in 2022 and realize that draconian cuts should have been implemented much sooner in the three-phased Rate Rationalization process
 - The failure of OPWDD leadership to force auspice changes as well as terminating contracts with more than 200 financially vulnerable OPWDD Medicaid providers has the service sector in a terribly vulnerable position for the people being served
 - The FEGS bankruptcy and the resulting report entitled “A Call to Action” may be viewed as a missed opportunity
- 9) Discussion of Key Survival Strategies, or, “Getting to the Other Side of the Pandemic”
