## Resources mentioned by HHS OCR Director Lisa J. Pino

Non-discrimination is central to President Biden's <u>National Strategy for the COVID-19</u>
<u>Response and Pandemic Preparedness, - PDF</u> including his Executive Order on <u>Ensuring an Equitable Pandemic Response and Recovery</u> and <u>Improving and Expanding Access to Care and Treatments for COVID-19</u>. HHS OCR has issued a number of guidance documents throughout COVID-19 to ensure that civil rights are protected during the pandemic and that non-discrimination is a central part of the Nation's efforts to test, vaccinate, and treat the public regardless of race, color, national origin, disability, gender, age, or sex. For example:

- OCR's February 4, 2022 guidance makes clear that in light of the continuing public health emergency, when resources can be scarce, it is vital that individuals with disabilities are not prevented from receiving needed health care benefits and services as this violates federal civil rights laws.
