HOSTAGE SPOTLIGHT- BRING THEM HOME NOW!

Agam Berger - By Lunny Melmed

Private Agam Berger was last seen in a Hamas Telegram video being dragged to a car at gunpoint still wearing her bloodied pajamas. After five months, aged 19, Agam is one of the youngest female hostages still being held in the clutches of depraved monsters. Agam was at her army post in Nahal Oz on that fateful Simchat Torah morning. In the final few minutes before being snatched away, Agam barely had time to call her father, Shlomi, and tell him she and her comrades were under fire. In those same terrifying moments, many of her fellow female soldiers, were brutally killed. These brave young women were our 'tatzpetaniot' or observers who had reported seeing Hamas terrorists and vehicles preparing for the oncoming slaughter prior to Black Saturday. Agam and her family are from Holon where she graduated from Kiryat Shareit school which has seen ten of its graduates killed on October 7th. Agam has been playing violin since age four and is an accomplished violinist with a promising career ahead. A fellow hostage (of the same name) Agam Goldstein, released during the partial truce, immediately called Agam's father, Shlomi, to relay birthday wishes to him from Agam as she had been held in the same terror tunnel. Shlomi learned that his daughter was the one "who calms everyone down. She braids all the girls' hair and I slept next to her last night." They had also been held in hidden apartments. Goldstein told Agam's observant parents that their daughter prays a lot, recites blessings before eating and tries to keep Shabbat. The terrorists knew she observed Shabbat and when ordered to cook and clean on that day, Agam courageously refused. Goldstein told Agam's parents that they had access to a watch which enabled them to keep track of Shabbat. In January, a video was released showing Agam and three other terrified young women, hands bound and bruised faces, apparently filmed shortly after their abduction. The U.K. Daily Mail featured a similar heart-wrenching picture of the four girls, all wounded and terrified. "We heard about the physical violence and as a father I can't imagine what my daughter is forced to endure. Our families are tormented." The parents of the captive girls have been travelling, appealing to parents and leaders world-wide to expedite their childrens' release and end the ongoing nightmare which is creeping into its 6th month.

SAFETY & SHUL DECORUM

For everyone's safety and to maintain proper decorum in shul, please make sure that your children are either next to an adult in shul, or in youth groups. If your intention is for them to come to groups, please make sure a parent brings them directly to the appropriate classroom. Many children have been running around the shul and it is a security concern as well as a disruption to the minyanim. We appreciate you having this conversation with your child prior to coming to shul.

YAHARZEIT OBSERVANCE IN A LEAP YEAR:

This year is a leap year, which means we have 2 months of Adar, Adar Rishon and Adar Sheni. Regarding the observance of a Yahrzeit, the rabbinic authorities debate which month is considered the "real Adar," with Sephardim and Ashkenazim differing in practice. Based on the Shulchan Aruch (568:7), the following is the procedure that people who have Yahrzeit in Adar should follow:

1. If your relative died in a leap year in Adar Rishon, then the Yahrzeit is in Adar Rishon.
2. If your relative died in a leap year in Adar Sheni, then the Yahrzeit is in Adar Sheni.
3. If your relative died in a regular year (non-leap year), if you are Ashkenazi, the main Yahrzeit is observed in Adar Rishon, but as a stringency, you would observe the Yahrzeit in Adar Sheni as well. As such, kaddish should be recited and a candle should be lit on both dates. However, since the main Yahrzeit is in the first Adar, a man's rights to lead the davening would be in Adar Rishon only and he is entitled to an Aliyah on the Shabbat prior to the Adar Rishon Yahrzeit only. If you are Sephardic, then the Yahrzeit is observed in Adar Sheni only, with all the associated practices. You are welcome to email rabbittopp@bethjacob.org if you have any questions.

Dear Beth Jacob Family,

This year, for our Shul's Mishloach Manot project, we'll be embarking on a special initiative which I'd like to explain and extend an invitation for you to participate.

The purpose of Mishloach Manot is to enable fellow Jews to fulfill their mitzvah of a Seudah (meal) on Purim and also "l'harbot ahava v'achva" to nurture our bonds of friendship and unity.

Recognizing the ongoing crisis in Israel and our deep connection to our Am Yisrael family, Beth Jacob has chosen this year to redirect our Mishloach Manot.
