Players of the Year



ANNA MORTAG
Brookfield Central
Senior

The senior forward was voted Greater Metro Conference Player of the Year and shattered the school scoring record, finishing with 1,522 points over her four-year varsity career. Mortag, an IUPUI commit, was a Division 1 WBCA all-state pick one year after earning honorable mention status. A finalist for top senior wing in the state, Mortag averaged a conference-best 19.9 points to go with 9.1 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game for the Lancers, who finished 15-9 overall and reached the regional final.



OLIVIA SOBCHAK
Oconomowoc
Senior

The senior forward was voted all-state in Division 1 by the WBCA after missing her entire junior season with a knee injury. Sobczak bounced back to earn co-Classic 8 Player of the Year honors, leading the conference in scoring at 20.8 points per game to go with an average of 8.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists. Finishing her career as Oconomowoc's all-time leading scorer at 1,268 points, Sobczak led the Raccoons to their first-ever state berth and was a finalist for top senior wing in the state.



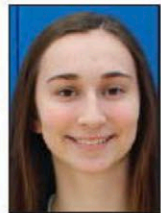

First Team



SAVANAH BALCERAK
Muskego
Senior

The senior guard, who is committed to compete in track and field at Belmont in Tennessee, was voted first team all-conference in the Classic 8 for the third straight year. Balcerak ended her career as the all-time leading scorer at Muskego — girls or boys — totaling 1,118 points. She surpassed her former teammate Maddy Harrison on the girls side, then went by A.J. Makinen. The most impactful floor general in the conference, Balcerak was one of the league's top scorers at 16.3 points per game this season.



ANGIE CERA
Mukwonago
Senior

The senior guard, arguably the best defensive player in the county, was recognized as a finalist for top senior defender in the state by WSN and a Co-Classic 8 Conference Player of the Year. An all-state selection in Division 1 by the WBCA — Cera was also honorable mention all-state as a sophomore — she led the Indians to their third straight Classic 8 title and averaged 15.1 points per game. The Milwaukee recruit was a first team all-conference selection for the third straight season and part of two state-qualifying teams.



ERIN HEDMAN
New Berlin Eisenhower
Senior

The senior forward picked up Division 2 all-state honors from the WBCA after averaging 12.0 points, 8.1 rebounds and 1.5 blocks per game, all of which were among league leaders in the loaded Woodland West Conference. Hedman, a Minnesota recruit and finalist for the state's top senior post, helped lead the Lions to a sectional semifinal appearance. The 6-foot-3 forward was one of the top 3-point shooters in the state (38.7%) and started for the Lions' state-finalist team as a sophomore.



LAUREN SCHILL
Pewaukee
Senior

The senior guard was named honorable mention all-state in Division 2 and led the Pirates to their first state berth in program history following back-to-back victories over Eisenhower and Pius in the sectional round. A first team all-conference pick for the third straight year, Schill led the Woodland West in scoring at 14.5 points per game. Committed to play soccer at Marquette University, Schill finishes her high school career as Pewaukee's second leading scorer in history with 1,382 points.

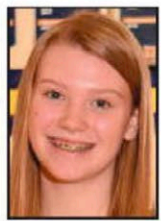

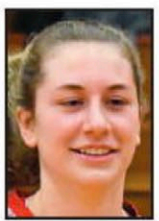
GRACE GROCHOLSKI

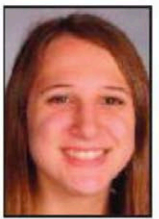
VIVIANNE JENDE

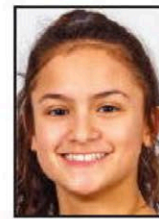
JULIA JENSEN
