Dear Friends,

"Under construction!" From the Corbin District downtown, to our own Chapel renovation this past fall—not to mention the work we may yet do as a result of Renew & Reimagine—we know that construction can bring its share of joys and challenges. It can be messy and slow, but also full of excitement, promise, and hope for the future.

As Christians, we know that "faith" is never static, it's always dynamic - and it's always under construction. This Lent, we are going to explore some of the foundational "building blocks" of our faith. Explore the Lord's Prayer through DOCC, the Nicene Creed in Discovery Hour, or the Letter to the Romans in Bible Study. Try committing to a new prayer practice—like Morning Prayer or Friday Stations of the Cross. Put your faith in action by exploring a new ministry or volunteering with one of our Outreach partners.

Start putting the pieces together, hang your "under construction" sign, and see how these 40 days might build you up in faith, hope, and love. Spiritual growth is not necessarily easy, but it is always worth it.

The Saint Luke's Stations of the Cross, composed of fourteen framed woodcuts, depict the sorrow & agony of Christ's Passion. "Walking" this path each Friday is a powerful and meaningful Lenten practice. All are welcome!



MAKE CONFESSION: THE RITE OF RECONCILIATION

Lent is a time to focus on returning to right relationship with God, our neighbors, and ourselves. Did you know that our Prayer Book offers the Rite of Reconciliation (also known as Confession)? JOIN IN A VIRTUAL PILGRIMAGE TO JERUSALEM

March 7 from 10am to 4pm, St. Mark's Episcopal Church, New Canaan

Lent is sometimes described as a *pilgrimage from Ashes to Alleluia*. Begin this Lent with a day-long retreat for Episcopalians all over Connecticut, hosted by St. Mark's in New Canaan.



Join Bishop Jeffrey Mello and Canon Iyad Qumri, from the Diocese of Jerusalem, in New Canaan to participate in a "virtual pilgrimage" through Jerusalem— including St. George's Cathedral, the Old City, Temple Mount, and Church of the Holy Sepulchre. You will be given time to pause, reflect, meditate, and pray as you walk in the footsteps of and learn more about the ministry of Jesus. Your day will conclude "walking" the Via Dolorosa, praying the Stations of the Cross.

This workshop is geared toward those who want to learn about pilgrimages to the Holy Land, those who have been on pilgrimage but want a refresher, or anyone who would like to go but cannot afford the time or expense of a full trip.
