## The Fourth Sunday of Easter

Dear Friends,

Once again, Happy Easter!! I keep saying it—we keep saying it—because it is Easter tide for almost another whole month. In fact, in some sense, it is always Easter, for we forever live on this side of the Resurrection. This Sunday, we hear Jesus describe himself as the Good Shepherd. It is a comparison beloved by so many of us for what it implies, and an image described in numerous places throughout scripture. There is also something profound about this, because as you'll recall, Jesus is referred to elsewhere as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world—the lamb himself now watches over the sheep.

I've also been thinking about this Good Shepherd imagery in the context of leadership in the church. You see, each and every one of us, whether we think of ourselves as a leader in the church or not (spoiler alert: you probably are!), is called into this sort of humble service as a shepherd. We are each called to look after one another, to nurture each other in the faith, to go search for someone if they get lost, to lend a hand when someone needs assistance, and to overall seek only what is best for those whom we lead. Yes, Jesus is our Good Shepherd, and just like in everything else, we are called to strive to be like Jesus, in this case as shepherds to each other.

Our Eastertide series, "The Beauty of Holiness" continues with a presentation by Dr. David Mahan from Yale Divinity School entitled "Poetry as a Way of Attentiveness: A Workshop." Dr. Mahan teaches religion and literature at Yale, focusing on modern to late-modern poetry and fiction and 'reading literature theologically.' He has also served as a campus minister at Yale since 1987, and co-directs the Rivendell Center for Theology and the Arts at Yale. He completed his MAR in Religion and the Arts at Yale Divinity School and his PhD in theology at the University of Cambridge (UK). In this workshop we will read select poems together, practicing attentiveness to the poetry to learn how poetry nurtures our ability to be attentive ourselves.
