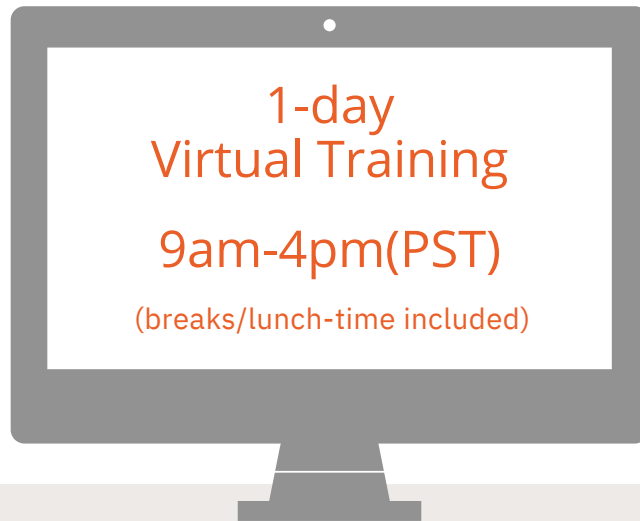

Youth Mental Health First Aid Training

Just like CPR First Aid teaches you skills to help during an emergency, Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches adults the skills to help during mental health distress and crisis. The First Aider will gain skills and confidence that will help you to reach out and provide initial help and support to a youth who may be developing a mental health, substance use problem or experiencing a crisis.

What you will learn

- Common signs and symptoms of mental health distress/illness/substance use/crisis
- First Aiders learn to apply the **ALGEE** action plan to support a youth through distress
- First Aiders learn to whom and how to refer the youth to self-care or appropriate professionals who can help
- First Aiders earn a certification valid for 3 years
- First Aiders receive 6 hours of instructional training toward professional development
 - Ask your employer about professional development reimbursement
