# Santa Clara County Library District Expands Online Library, Virtual Programming, and Offers Free Job Search Resources

All Santa Clara County Residents are Eligible for a Library eCard

SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIF. – As directed by the County of Santa Clara, Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) libraries will remain closed through the end of May as part of the updated Shelter in Place order. Despite the closure, library staff is working to continuously expand online library services and provide even more online programs to all in Santa Clara County residents.

The main page of the new website, [sccl.org](http://sccl.org), has been redesigned to focus on online resources, virtual programs and available services. A [Storytime Online](#) page was created to highlight the offerings dedicated to kids. Some of the online services include [Family Storytimes](#) (Monday-Saturday), bilingual storytimes in [Spanish](#) and [Mandarin](#), and [School Age Storytime](#) on Tuesday, all of which are streamed on Facebook Live (@SCCLD).

For those who may be in need of employment help and resources, JobNow offers free online live personal assistance for resume and cover letter review and skill matching to help identify different career options based on skill sets. This is one of many online resources available from the Library for [job, career and professional development](#). SCCLD is also hosting a series of virtual events with [SCORE on How to Start your own Business](#). Each weekly session will be held in May on Thursdays from 6:00-7:30pm. Online registration is required. Sessions are free and open to the public to participate online.

SCCLD also offers free resources for students who are distance learning from home. [Brainfuse HelpNow](#) provides homework and writing assistance and live one-on-one tutoring in a wide variety of subjects. The Library has study resources for students of all ages, including adult learners.

The Library encourages engagement, entertainment, and conversation through [Virtual Film Clubs](#) for adults, [Virtual Book Clubs](#) for all ages, [Online ESL Conversation Clubs](#), and more. As part of Asian/Pacific Islander American Heritage Month, SCCLD is hosting several programs to commemorate the event, including a presentation about Chinese migrant laborers who helped build the Transcontinental Railroad.

“Our patrons miss coming to the library and we miss being able to serve them in person,” Acting County Librarian Jennifer Weeks said. “With the safety of our staff and patrons as our number one priority, the library can most successfully provide services and programs online from our website, social media, Zoom, text and chat, as well as by phone. We continue to deliver important services and resources to our communities, now virtually.”

To ensure that everyone has access to these free resources, SCCLD is offering temporary [eCard registration](#) access to all Santa Clara County residents. That means free access to enjoy [eBooks](#), [Audiobooks](#), [eMagazines and digital newspapers](#), [streaming movies and music](#), and dozens of [online resources](#) for students, job seekers, and people of all ages. There are also [video tutorials](#) to help patrons navigate these resources.

Staff is available seven days a week from 10 am - 6 pm to answer questions via Email, text, and chat and phone. Live support is available to help patrons with their [research, collection-related inquiries](#) and [account questions](#).

The Santa Clara County Library District (SCCLD) promotes knowledge, ideas, and cultural enrichment. Its collection includes more than 2 million books, videos, CDs, DVDs/Blu-rays, audiobooks, eBooks and extensive online resources accessible from anywhere with an internet connection. In 2014, SCCLD celebrated one hundred years of service to local residents.

For the last twelve years, SCCLD has been consistently recognized as one of America's Star Libraries by Library Journal. In 2019, SCCLD was ranked among the top ten libraries in the United States with expenditures over \$30 million in their Index of Public Library Service, tops in California. In 2014 and 2019, SCCLD won Innovator Awards from the Urban Libraries Council. SCCLD also received a Challenge Award in 2019 from the California State Association of Counties.

SCCLD includes two bookmobiles, an online library, seven community libraries and one branch library serving Campbell, Cupertino, Gilroy, Los Altos, Los Altos Hills, Milpitas, Monte Sereno, Morgan Hill, Saratoga and the unincorporated areas of Santa Clara County. In 2019, SCCLD had over 428,000 library accounts and welcomed 3.4 million visitors, who borrowed 10.2 million items.
