

FY2025 Crawford Marion ADAMH Board Provider Application for Board Funding released.

The Crawford Marion ADAMH Board (Board) is pleased to announce that the Provider Application for Board Funding (PABF) process for FY2025 (July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025) is now open.

The ADAMH Board has identified and prioritized needs in our community. Those priority areas are detailed more fully below. All applicants are encouraged to review the priorities listed, as the ADAMH Board is willing to consider subsidizing some costs to establish priority programming in these areas. In addition to the priorities listed, the ADAMH Board will entertain applications submitted to address other areas of need which are not listed.

The PABF will not be posted to our website. The PABF can be requested from Brian.Penrod@mcadamh.com. When requesting the application, please indicate whether your agency holds any certification through OhioMHAS.

Overview of ADAMH Board focus for Provider Application for Board Funding for FY2025 PABF:

- A. Crisis Services, Services shall be provided in accordance with applicable requirements of the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 5122 and all other applicable laws and regulations. Application should be specific as to what services will be covered. The ADAMH Board is interested in developing a Mobile Response for Adults. This program would provide a mobile response in the community for adults in crisis. ADAMH Board will consider subsidy to be negotiated;
- B. Peer Supporters – The ADAMH Board is looking for a program(s) to use peer supporters in traditional as well as in new and innovative ways, including system outreach. Potential uses may include within the agency treatment program, care coordination for behavioral health inpatient hospitalizations, care coordination/linkage of individuals from emergency department to SUD provider, QRT peer support, for individuals in specialized dockets. This is not

a complete list and applicants are encouraged to submit proposals. The ADAMH Board is prepared to entertain proposals which request financial support for a portion of the cost to administer a program with competitive pay rates for peer supporters and their supervision. In short, the ADAMH Board will consider subsidy to be negotiated.

- C. Mental Health Case Management – The ADAMH Board is looking to fund one or more agencies to provide case management services to adults with SPMI diagnosis and/or children/youth with SED diagnosis. This funding is to pay for services not traditionally paid for by Medicaid or other sources and will be used to provide services not paid for by other means.
- D. Substance Use Disorder Case Management - The ADAMH Board is looking to fund one or more agencies to provide case management services to adults in SUD treatment.
- E. Housing – The ADAMH Board is requesting applicants who may be interested in developing housing to submit proposals. Housing projects must be focused on providing services to individuals with mental health and/or substance abuse disorder. Projects in this category should address the gap in services or problem which the project will help alleviate. The ADAMH Board understands that projects in this category will most likely take a longer time to develop than the traditional PABF. The ADAMH Board would entertain proposals focusing on Family Recovery Housing and/or youth focused housing.
- F. Support group and/or support services for caretakers of children whose parents have SUD issues.
- G. Pregnant Women supports – Development of programming for pregnant women that includes initiating medication assisted treatment (MAT) combined with behavioral health therapy, and supportive services.

Notes and Special Instructions:

- Applicants for the FY2025 PABF process are NOT required to apply to provide all services listed above. Applicants should state in their narrative which program service(s) they are proposing to fill along with which county (Marion, Crawford, both), age group(s), specific populations, etc. to benefit from the proposed project.
 - If applying to provide one or more new service(s) listed in the PABF, please either complete one budget form and narrative for each service separately, or complete one budget narrative for the entire submission and in the narrative provide explanation of budget needs for each service applied for.
 - For services with an established Medicaid service code and unit rate, the ADAMH Board will pay the Medicaid rate. Please use the "Other" line item to

enter requested ADAMH Funding amount (# of Units x Medicaid rate). The service code and name should be entered in the Narrative Response cell.

- Successfully funded and contracted projects will include expectations for the collection of data, outcomes measures, system performances, and cost effectiveness.
- The ADAMH Board will be in contact to set up a meeting to clarify our understanding about the application, including requesting more detail about the budget or narrative.
- The PABF application should only be completed by agencies which are:
 - Requesting to be considered for a new Purchase of Service (POS) contract with the Crawford-Marion ADAMH Board;
 - Would like to develop a program to address one of the priorities identified by the Board of Directors below; or,
 - Have identified a need in the community and would like to develop or expand an existing program.
- For all agencies with an existing POS contract in FY2024, a timeline to negotiate contracts for FY2025 will occur per requirements in the POS contract. Those agencies currently in a FY2024 POS contract who are interested in being considered for one of the services listed below or a new service should complete the PABF process.
