**Support our farmers' markets:** The Swarthmore Farmer's Market is slated to open this Sat., June 6, masks are required and social distancing enforced. Pre-orders ONLY, for time specific pickup, will be the sole method of purchase, there will be no on-site sales at this time. This is to control the flow of people,
