The tower design is intended to be an educational experience to inspire visitors to climb or ride the elevator to each of the three levels to learn the full history of the role the Beirut Peacekeepers played in Lebanon.

More than 10,000 American veterans served in Beirut over a three-year period from 1982 to 1984 as part of a multinational peacekeeping force that included French, Italian, and British troops. They were there to provide stability in Lebanon after a series of factional conflicts. The peacekeepers suffered multiple attacks and casualties leading up to the two suicide bombings that killed 241 Americans and 55 French service members.

The groundbreaking will include speakers who will share the personal, historical, and national significance of the Beirut Peacekeepers and their story. Many Beirut veterans and Gold Star families will be attending and all are invited.

HEROIC TALES:

The Contributions of Women and Black Service Members During the Vietnam War







"HONORING ALL WHO SERVED"

On July 29, 1948, US President Harry Truman issued Executive Order 9981, establishing equality of treatment and opportunity in the Armed Services. At the start of the Korean War integration had begun; sixteen months after the war ended, the US Army reported it was fully integrated. The Vietnam War would then see the first time in US history that service men of all races would serve together on equal terms. But how equal was it really? Did equal on the battlefield also mean equal at home? Black Americans served in every US military conflict, yet their contributions in the Vietnam War are marginalized and they have even had their patriotism questioned. Black service members have taken immense pride in serving their country at war, but racism was still prevalent even in the war zone of Vietnam.

What about the 11,000 women who served in Vietnam during the war? The nurses and other female military members serving in this era are often referred to as the "Forgotten Veterans of Vietnam." While women were not serving in combat or on the frontlines, they were put in dangerous situations and could not be protected from the brutality of the conflict. Eight female service members lost their lives in the line of duty, and their names are forever inscribed beside their brothers on the Vietnam Wall Memorial in Washington DC. But what about recognition for the remaining female veterans? It took the women veterans from the Vietnam War over 10 years of petitioning and fighting to receive their own memorial in 1993. Why was is so hard for these women to receive recognition for their service in war?

During the months of February and March the Military Heritage Museum offers a special exhibit in the museum's atrium titled "Heroic Tales: The Contributions of Black and Women Service Members During the Vietnam War", which seeks to show the story of the first racially integrated US military serving in war together and the accomplishments of Black servicemen throughout the two decades of fighting in the hostile terrain of Vietnam. The exhibit will also highlight the important roles US women filled during the Vietnam War. Without the nurses and the female service members working hard in Vietnam throughout the conflict, even more male service members would have never made it home. And we cannot overlook the roles of the morale boosting civilian women who volunteered to be sent into the warzone by the Red Cross Supplemental Recreational Activities Overseas (SRAO) program. The part these "Donut Dollies" filled was invaluable to the men serving on the front lines.

Through artifacts and videos "Heroic Tales" will show how the service of Black American men and women veterans of all races affected the Vietnam War. See and hear the stories of the Vietnam era Black American soldiers and the women Vietnam veterans at the Military Heritage Museum. The true impact of these two groups during the Vietnam War cannot be overlooked or ignored.



BASIC NAVIGATION COURSE

This is a beginner course for basic skills in reading and interpreting a Nautical Chart (you will be provided with a waterproof Charlotte Harbor Chart), what the symbols on your chart mean, and the rules of the road in navigation coastal areas. You will learn the difference between True Course, Magnetic Variation and Compass Deviation and how to plot a course, Dead Reckoning, and how to get a fix. There is also a segment about GPS and how the system works.

BOAT SAFETY COURSE

BOAT AMERICA (Boating Safety Course) This course is required by law for anyone born on or after January 1, 1988, to operate a powerboat or PWC. This is a seven to eight hour course from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Upon completion of the class instruction there will be a sixty question examination, and upon successful completion of the examination in approximately two and half weeks you will receive a permanent lifetime plastic card from Florida Fish and Wildlife. The course is an introduction to safe boating, boating



laws and regulations, personal safety and the safety of your passengers, the type and use of safequipment, trailering, storing of your boat, protecting your boat, recreational usage, ability identify the Aids to Navigation (ATON) and the rules of the road and proper techniques of anchor and securing your boat at the dock. If you own a boat, take the plastic card or certificate to y boat insurance agent for a possible discount on your boat insurance.

Classes are held at the Military Heritage Museum, 900 West Marion Avenue, Punta Gorda, Floi in the Museum Library. Parking is in the lot under the building, take the elevator to the secon floor, turn right and right again to the library. For those who are attending a Boat America of you should bring lunch and eat it in the outside dining area or on the first-floor cafe area. All drimust be covered. You will be given a 45-minute lunch break.

Create a Memory



The United States Congress created the Veterans History Project (VHP 2000 as part of the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress. V collects, preserves and makes accessible the firshand remembrances of military veterans from World War I through the more recent conflicts.

Deceased Veterans

Next of kin of deceased veterans may donate original photographs, lett diaries and unpublished memoirs of a deceased veteran, and must sub the Biographical Data Form and a Veteran's Release form on behalf of deceased veteran. The collection must meet the minimum collect standards.



Gold Star Families

Under the Gold Star Families Voices Act (Public Law 114-246), VHP a accepts oral histories by immediate family members (parent, spouse, sible or child) of members of the Armed Forces who died as a result of their service during a period of war. Due to the sensitive nature of the Gold Star of histories, the Veterans History Project requires a minimum age of 18 for both the interviewers and interviewees.



Group Participants

In addition to individual volunteers, the Veterans History Project acce collections from organization around the country interested in participat in a grassroots community project. They include high school, univer and college classrooms; libraries; veterans service organizations; pla of worship; retirement communities; Scout troops; local businesses; a professional associations.
