Board Members are expected to:

 - Finance and Sponsorship Committee
 - Marketing and Programs Committee
 - Ad Hoc Committees developed as needed
- Attend an annual strategic planning retreat (if possible)

CURC seeks to include representation from different types and sizes of higher ed institutions across the U.S. and Canada.
