1. What are your top priorities for improving public education? In your opinion, what do we do well as a state and how can we improve Pre-K-12 education?

We will raise teacher salaries by 30 percent while also implementing a new privately run, annual review of each teacher to keep these professionals actively improving their own skills.

5. How can the government effectively partner with parents and families to support student and school success – especially in underserved communities?

Promotion of a school environment that is conducive to learning and supports strong family and community partnerships. Schools shall frequently communicate school performance, student progress, personalized learning strategies, and academic opportunities, using both print and online formats. Also, schools shall encourage business partnerships to assist students in the successful transition to employment or further education.

6. What are you going to do to incorporate the voice, participation, and leadership from parents in order to close the gap in academic achievement for students of color?

Reading and math performance of minority students must be improved in order to support graduation from high school and university attendance or success in vocational and trade schools. Ongoing teacher training is important. Assessing teachers' attitudes prior to employment is recommended. In addition, hiring minority teachers must also be a top priority. The community must demand that these procedures are followed by the school board and school district administrators.
