

One Moving Moment

There are many moving moments in each of our personal histories. Moments that stand out in our memories. Moments that inspire us forever. I was reminded of one such moment during a Tuesday morning Bible study.

It occurred on a summer day before my senior year in a Maryland high school. Young Life met weekly at my house during that summer. One of our leaders brought her quadriplegic friend, Joni (pronounced *Johnny*) Eareckson, to our gathering. About five years earlier, at the age of 17, Joni had become paralyzed from the neck down as a result of a diving accident in Maryland waters. During the early years of rehabilitation, she had weathered deep depression through the faithfulness of Christian friends and had learned how to paint with a brush between her teeth. She was now being recognized as a promising young artist. She came to my home to speak to our Young Life group about God's mercy and grace in her life. Her vibrant message of love for God and confidence in His will had an enormous impact on my life that day. It was her inspiration that led me to memorize Romans 8:28: **We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.**

Joni went on to write her autobiography, *Joni*, and later recreated her own life in a full-length feature film by Billy Graham's World Wide Pictures company. I have followed her activities through the years as she has written more books, become an accomplished artist, recorded songs, and married Ken Tada in 1982. I liked to catch her daily five-minute radio program, *Joni and Friends*. She has worked on national committees to build help for the disabled, traveled the world, and continues to be a highly sought-after conference speaker. I really enjoyed her wonderful, sensitive witness on the Larry King Show in 2003. How it reminded me of that high school summer! clips. You will hear the prayer she prayed in despair during her hospitalization: "God, if I can't die, show me how to live." She is a joy-filled, well-loved woman and God


Happy Retirement!

Thanks to Rosie Drenning you will find these books and others like them in the Church library. Please borrow and then return them so others may also enjoy the light reading these books provide.




