It was Mid-October 1992 – I found myself at 11,000 feet on the Flattops of Colorado about 2 miles north of Deep Lake. Elk and deer season would begin the following Saturday and I established an early camp ahead of my dad, brother-in-law and best friend. All of whom were coming up on Friday, but I needed time alone. My life was, literally, a mess – and like I had done so many times before, was counting on MY “skills”, MY “wisdom”, seeking a salvation through my own efforts. To be honest, I could already see that I was doomed to failure in those endeavors.

I decided late Wednesday afternoon to walk in the meadow just to the east of camp. Clouds from a coming storm were beginning to move into the area and shafts of sunlight broke through, highlighting vignettes of scenery. One such shaft, spotlighted a small ermine hunting chipmunks along a rotting spruce tree. His white and brown coat flashed in the sun, as he darted after one little chipmunk. I was sitting on a stump watching this as the chipmunk flashed by my feet. The little weasel ran right over my boot, looked at me as if to say – “excuse me”, then ran on in pursuit. The beauty of the moment reminded me about purpose and right focus. I was focused on the wrong things.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:4-7 ESV)

Up to that point in my living, my focus was always on the wrong things. Perhaps if I had taken the time to read my Bible previously and had found this passage, I might have turned things around a lot quicker. But it was a start – over the next few years, the Holy Spirit began to mold me into someone who understands compassion, who lived through deep emotional breaks, and someone who finally began to understand that leadership is not centered on the “I” but should be focused on Jesus Christ alone.

For that brief time, however – it was a start. The Peace of God entered into me that day. As I have aged, I am finding that most things can be handled nicely by allowing the Peace of God to keep you focused and centered on things of Jesus Christ. Where are you focused today?

They are planning on having an obstacle bounce house, bubble machine, light snacks and more. This is a family event and open to the whole community.




Ruth - Unshaken - “dedicated to my mother-in-law...whom I admire and adore.”

Bathsheba - Unspoken - “dedicated to women who feel they’ve lost their reputation forever. God can make beauty from ashes.”


Mary - Unaframed - “dedicated to Jane Jordan Browne, a woman of faith.”

MISSIONS

Gideon's International will be the focus for the July mission offering. Gideons are God-called members, brothers and sisters in Christ, striving side by side to effectively and joyfully reach the world with the Good News. Members of The Gideons International personally witness and distribute God's Word to police, fire, and medical personnel; prisoners; military personnel; students in the fifth grade and above; and those with whom they interact on a daily basis. Scriptures are also placed by Gideons and Auxiliary in key locations, including hotels, motels, hospitals, convalescent homes, medical offices, domestic violence shelters, prisons, and jails.

The August mission offering will go to the Village at Morrison's Cove Good Samaritan's Fund. This fund was established over 40 years ago to help offset the cost of caring for residents who do not have financial resources. This can include payment for medication, activities and haircuts. The funding can also be used for wheelchairs, beds, and electric lifts. Whatever residents need to assist with their daily lives, the Good Samaritan Fund provides it.

Vacation Bible School was held June 6-9 here at the New Enterprise Church of the Brethren. This year we went with a four day VBS, which seemed to work well.

The theme was "Heroes- Trusting God." Each night

featured a different biblical "hero": Noah, Jonah, David and Zaccheus. Kids learned the different ways and situations in which they trusted and listened to God. Each night opened with a skit featuring the hero of the day, followed by singing (with choreography!), games, crafts, snacks, and Bible lesson time. We had between 45-60 kids each evening.

This year we collected dog food, cat food, litter, leashes, snacks, etc. as well as monetary donations for the Bedford County Humane Society. There was even a competition to see who could raise more monetary donations: cats, or dogs. A cat and dog bank was placed in the fellowship hall for kids to put their money in. They named the cat bank "Trixie" and the dog bank "Billy." The dogs won, but it was a fairly close contest. The kids raised \$889.65 for the Humane Society.

Donations of water and Gatorade were also collected to be given to the Southern Cove Fire Company. They were very gracious and volunteered their time every evening to slow down traffic on 869 in front of the church and make sure that parents and kids got across the road safely. We are so thankful for our volunteer fire fighters!

On Thursday evening, the kids got a special treat from the Dairy Princess and the Guernsey Princess— ice cream sandwiches! What a great week!
