Pastor's Pen

A favorite activity of our family on vacation in late August was Hubba Hubba Highway in Water Country USA. All of us, from 7 to 67 years old, found floating around the “lazy river” relaxing, cooling fun in the sun. We were propelled by underwater jet spray in just 3’3” of water, so life vests were optional. But we also found that life vests allowed us to relax and experience greater joy in relief from stress. The same was true of the large surfside pool where we experienced the joy of floating in the steady rhythm of giant ocean waves. While a swimmer with basic skills does not need a life vest, what a delight to float with assurance that, releasing all tension, one won’t sink, even in the potentially dangerous waters.


The resting in a life jacket in the expanse of troubled waters reminds me of resting in God’s Spirit while living in a troubled world. Over and over the Bible invites us to abide in God – to rest in God, to dwell in God. More than fifty times Paul tells us to live “in Christ.”

How do we abide in God, in Christ? Might it be something like consciously putting on the life vest that is God’s Spirit and prayerfully abiding in the assurance of God’s steadfast care?

Upon returning home from this vacation, I reread Shane Claiborne’s comments about contemplative prayer in *Common Prayer: A Liturgy for Ordinary Radicals*. He was describing our difficulties in really trusting and abiding in God with an example from Teresa of Avila whom I admire. Teresa was a contemplative who lived in Spain in the 16th century. She described how she was often distracted by her own thoughts and worries in prayer, but she learned not to fight these distractions but to let them come and go like the waves of the sea, trusting that God was an anchor that would hold her through any storm. How like my experience in the life vest!

Claiborne also said, “Many of us have grown up thinking of prayer as a checklist of requests to God, like giving a grocery list to someone headed to the supermarket. As one kid said, ‘I’m heading off to pray – does anyone need anything?’ Prayer is certainly about sharing our concerns and frustrations with God... Still, contemplative prayer goes deeper... Prayer is less about trying to get God to do something we want God to do and more about getting ourselves to do what God wants us to do

Bible Studies

Be sure to get yours by coming up to camp – anything left over will be brought back & sold on Sunday, **no guarantees!**



The Jesus Chronicles

Mark's Story

by Tim LaHaye and Jerry B. Jenkins

“Mark’s Story is a thrilling account that vividly depicts the day before Jesus’ crucifixion and the danger that early believers faced as they boldly proclaimed Him Christ as the Lord. Mark chronicles the growth of the early Church, the struggles of Jesus’ followers, and the persecution its members endured from a hostile world. Their bravery laid the foundation for the Christian Church, and their fervent passion for the Word still reverberates throughout the world today.”

This quote from the front jacket gives a powerful description of the stories Mark will accumulate for the book of Mark - the second book of the New Testament.

This book written by the authors LaHaye and Jenkins uses the book of Mark to tell their story quoting the entire book as found in the Bible.

But what makes it different is the underlying story of Mark, his mother (Mary), his cousin (Joses also called Barnabas), Paul (also called Saul) and of course Peter (one of the original disciples). Using Mark’s insatiable need for the true story of Jesus’ life he quizzed Peter constantly. It is these stories and explanations of their meaning that is published in Mark’s book.

So you will need to have both the Bible and this book at your disposal to truly compare and make the connection of the impact Jesus’ life and crucifixion had on the early church.

It will definitely expand your understanding of this time period of history.
