DWC COMMITTEES

Arts & Culture – Plans social and educational artistic endeavors for club members and the community such as the Youth Art Fair (contest).

Bylaws – Review the bylaws and make any necessary changes.

Communications/Public Relations – Publicizes and promotes activities externally (Darien marquee, Darien connect, Patch). Manages social media.

Civic Engagement & Outreach – Encourage active engagement of members and public in civic issues. Recent projects have been School Supplies Drive, Little Store at Burgess Square for local nursing home, Soap Collection, Canned good collection, Giving Tree (toys for needy children) and Gift Wrapping of the Toys, Spring Bags for residents of Burgess Square, Mother's Day Bags for women in shelters, checking IDs (at Darien Fest, Summer concerts, and Oktoberfest), and participation in the 4th of July parade.

Education & Libraries – Promote literacy and education awareness; Help select the winners of the 2 Community Service Scholarships and the 2 Fine Arts Scholarships.

Environment – Help plan environmental projects. Projects include Adopt-A-Highway, Pollinator Gardens, and recycling (empty Pill Bottles, Pop Can Tabs, Styrofoam, and items for SCARCE)

Finance – Audits Treasurer's books and overseas compliance with regulatory requirements for DWC and DWC's charity fund. They also collect and keep on file conflict of interest statements from required board members.

Health & Wellness – Organizing volunteers and member donations for blood drive and serving breakfast and lunch at TLC camp for youth cancer survivors

Hospitality – Responsible for setting up any refreshments at general meetings and cleaning up afterwards.

Membership – Update membership form and brochure; help with the recruitment and retaining members; new member orientation; create welcome folder and manage mentor program; track dues and number of members attending each meeting; host the Membership table at monthly general meetings with name tags and Guest Book.

Nominating – Finds members who would like to take an officer position (Executive Board) for the next year.

Philanthropy – Decides where we will donate the money we raised during the year.

Programs – Plan programs for the coming year, including May Banquet.

Social – Help plan social activities such as Breakfast Club; Luncheons; Bunco, Bridge, Film and Travel Group.

Technology – Update our website and supports technology needs.

Ways & Means (Fundraising) – The following fundraising projects have been held to support our Philanthropic donations: Gift Cards, Lottery, Plant Sales, Bake Sales, and Children's Resales.

Yearbook – Format, proofread and distribute member directory and solicit ads from businesses.
