

1. Fall Protection regulations.
 - a. Federal OSHA has been trying to get Cal/OSHA to accept a 6 foot trigger height for residential roofing and framing operations for 16 years.
 - b. CALPASC Director of Risk Management, Bruce Wick, has worked with other coalition partners to keep up the fight.
 - c. On May 29, 2019, a Berkeley research firm filed a Specialized Regulatory Impact Assessment(SRIA) on the annual cost of the change.
 - d. The firm understated the net cost of the regulations in 2020 by 1,000%.
 - e. Bruce Wick issued a letter of protest on June 7, 2019.
 - f. CALPASC and the California Framing Contractors Association will continue the fight to keep California's fall protection regulations where they are.
