Sunday **Parents in Conversation series "Bad Parents of the Bible"** (September 4th - 25th, 9:30a led by Amy Peterson in the Clark Room).

Want to know what biblical parenting is? The parents we see in Genesis raise children who murder, steal, and lie...On September 4, Amy will lead us in a discussion about what the Bible is, how it works, and how to approach its more difficult texts. Then over the next few weeks, we'll walk through Genesis together, revisiting stories from childhood (or reading them for the first time!). This will be a time where all questions and responses to the biblical text are welcome, and we'll look for what is life-giving in each story, and how to pass these stories on appropriately to our children.

Children's Sunday School - meets down the stairs from the entry way by the playground. There are three classes: Godly Play 1 (3 year olds (fully potty trained) through Pre-K), Godly Play 2 (Kindergarten through 2nd grade), and Rite in the Middle (3rd-5th grades). **Children's Hour follows** Godly Play from 10:30-11:30. It is for three year olds through 2nd grade. We have a quick snack in the Undercroft and our own worship service in the Redwood Chapel. Children will join their parents for the service after The Peace.

"ANGST"- DINNER & A MOVIE, SEPTEMBER 25 - 6:00 P



NEW SANCTUS AND FRACTION We have new service music this season. Enjoy the challenge and beauty from composer Malcolm Archer (b. 1952). The music comes from his Mass called the Sewanee Service, written in honor of Sewanee, The University of the South. He is much in demand internationally as a conductor, composer and organist. He has over 250 published works, which include organ and choral works, and more. He most recently participated in the Queen's Jubilee service. His career has taken him to several English Cathedrals as Director of Music, including Wells and St. Paul's, and for eleven years he was Director of Chapel Music at Winchester College.

WORSHIP IN THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH is grounded in the Book of Common Prayer. The order of service includes details to help you participate with more ease. We sit to listen to the scripture lessons and the sermon, and we stand to sing, to recite the Creed, and to listen to the Gospel Lesson. When it comes to prayer, both standing and kneeling are ancient and accepted practices---so please feel free to stand or kneel during our prayers, whichever most enriches your worship. **Before worship, please observe quiet for prayer and meditation, and silence any device that may disturb you or your neighbor.** Further instructions are listed throughout our leaflet. Congregational responses are printed in **boldface** type.



Healing Station Available at All Services

During each service, a healing station is offered for your prayer and intercession. The healing station is to the left of the pulpit. You are welcome to visit the station before the service begins or after you receive communion. Trained lay leaders and clergy offer anointing with holy oil. You can ask for specific prayers for yourself or those you love, or simply receive the anointing.






WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY Tuesday at 9:30a








Altar Guild Informational Meeting—Sunday, October 2, 2022 at 12:00p.


