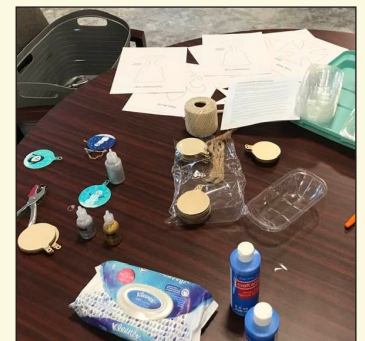


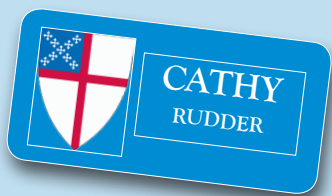
PARENTS IN CONVERSATION SUNDAYS AT 9:30A

COFFEE HOUR

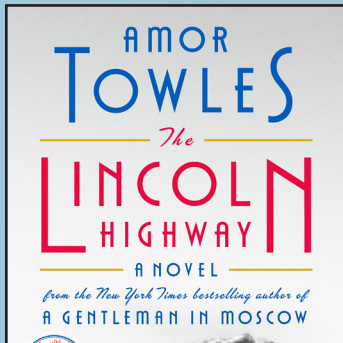

The commemoration of the twenty-fifth ordination anniversary of The Reverend Dr. R. Scott White **has been postponed** due to COVID concerns..

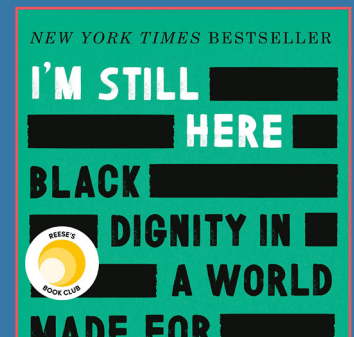


SECOND CHAPTER BOOKCLUB THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 10 | 10:00A

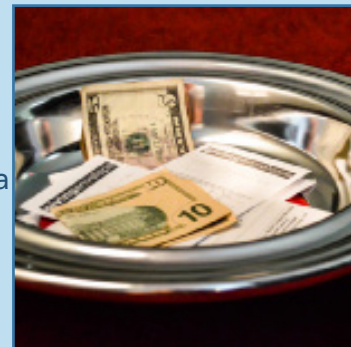


THE TRINITY CAREGIVERS' GROUP

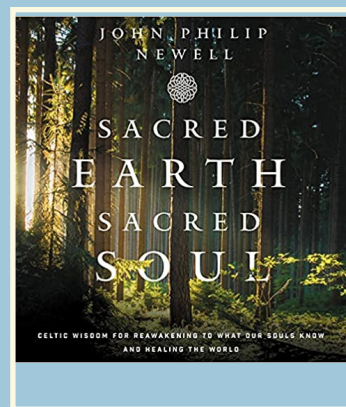

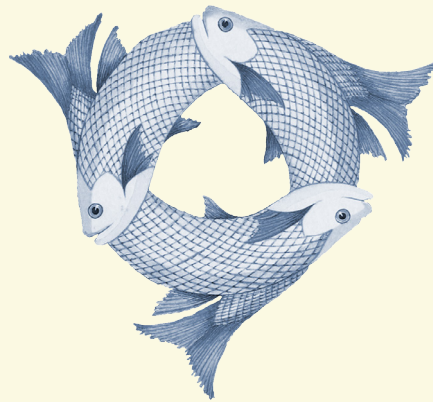
