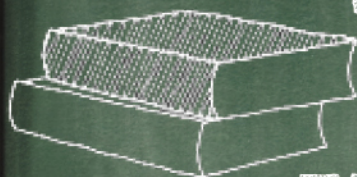


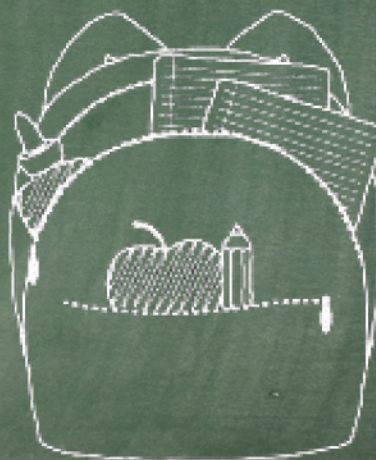

Locks and Lockers

No more cubbies! Now, every student gets his/her own locker! You can have so much fun making your locker designed especially for you! Want to get shelves to stay organized? Want a dry erase board? A mirror? Be creative and make it your own!

Tip: Make sure that the shaft of your lock isn't thicker than a standard Master lock. It may not fit into the hole of your locker!



Schedule

On the first day of school you'll receive your own schedule, telling you which classes you have at each part of the day. What information will you find on your schedule?

The day is divided into nine "periods". Each period of the day is for a different subject. You will have a different teacher for almost every subject. On your schedule, you will see what subject you will have each period, and who your teacher will be.

And don't forget your room! For most of your periods, you will be switching rooms to go to your next subject. You will move from room to room with all of the other students in your homeroom class, so you'll always be moving around with friends. (Remember that you will have two homerooms – one for your Torah Studies, and one for General Studies.)

Sounds confusing? Don't worry, within a few school days you'll be a pro!

What are "Modules"?

Every period of your day is the same every day of the week. Whatever you have Period 1 on Monday, you will have on Tuesday, Wednesday, and so on.

There is only one exception: Your last period - Period 9. It's called the "module" period. This is the only period that changes every day of the week.

What are some of the things we have for module? We have Computers, Safe, Gym, Art, and many other classes. Every day of the week is different. Not to worry – everything will appear on your schedule!



School Bells

Whenever a period begins or ends, you will hear a school bell. With nine periods during the day, that's a lot of bells!!

When a period ends, and the bell sounds, that is a signal to the teacher to dismiss the class. But wait – don't rush out yet! Show proper derech eretz and wait for the teacher to dismiss you before you pack up and leave.

Teachers

One of the biggest changes of the Middle School is that you'll have so many teachers. Each subject will have its own teacher!

Will you have a hard time remembering all their names? No, don't worry. Within a few days you'll know them all. And until then – you can always check your schedule to remind you!

Every teacher has his/her own style, and it may take a little time to get used to it. But I know you'll get the hang of it!



Tests

Everyone's favorite part of school, right? The truth is, you already know what tests are like, and they're basically the same in the Middle School. The main difference is that each teacher will give his/her own test for that subject.

What about making time to study? Yes, that's important. Some subjects might be easier or more enjoyable to you, and you may find other subjects harder or less interesting. That's fine; everyone has things they like. But everyone needs to be careful to give each subject a proper amount of time. Maybe you'll be able to ace one subject with very little review, and another subject will need more time. You'll have to see, and be responsible with it.

School Supplies

Tip: Try to avoid having separate notebooks for each subject; you'll end up carrying a very heavy knapsack! Have one loose-leaf for your morning subjects, and another for your afternoon subjects. This way you only need one loose-leaf with you at any time, and the other can be in your locker. That will keep your load light, as you travel from class to class during the day!
