Celebrating Saints and Stewardship!

Driving to church on a Sunday morning near the end of October, I snapped this picture from my phone and posted it on Facebook. I was pleasantly surprised by the number of "Likes" it received. Several people commented on the beauty of the sky. One person noted, "Creation on

fire with possibility!" another, "A blessed glorious sunrise! Beauty from God," and another, "God is the great artist." Another person, St. Matthew's own Alice Moody responded with "When morning gilds the sky...." This is a reference to one of the hymns in the Hymnal 1982 which we use each week:



When morning gilds the sky, our hearts awaking cry: May Jesus Christ be praised! in all our work and prayer we ask his loving care: May Jesus Christ be praised!

Indeed! May Jesus Christ be praised! I am always impressed by how we are moved to awe and wonder by the things we see in creation. It happens in a variety of ways and at unexpected times. For some, they are drawn to awe and wonder by walking in the woods. My daughter is moved by the mountains of the Pacific Northwest. Others, by standing on the banks of a lake or on the beach looking out at the ocean and following the rhythm of the rolling waves. I remember once, during the phase of the pandemic when we were gathering outside for worship. It was in the fall, and I could not help but be distracted by the trash bin that was quite stinky that day! After the service, Randy Davenport came up to me with a big smile on his face and shared how beautiful and colorful the trees were that morning. He said he was taken in by their beauty and couldn't take his eyes off them during the service!

God's creation has a way of mesmerizing us, pulling us in, and gifting us with awe and wonder.

We greet the month of November with a number of festivals and religious observances celebrating the bounty of the harvest and giving thanks for the saints – those men and women, known and unknown, who have gone before us and root us into our spiritual family.

A central tenet of Christian faith is that of stewardship. That we have been entrusted to look after and care for all that we have been given. Holiness is not something only reserved for those who have "gone before," but is a goal that each of us should strive for in our day-to-day living. This takes commitment and intentionality and requires us to live mindfully and be continually aware of how God is moving in our lives.

So let us welcome holy November and celebrate stewardship as way of life and as a pathway to sainthood!

November: Make Every Day a Thanksgiving

Also, pray this Psalm during the day as another way to remember how God works in your life:

Psalm 105 1-8

Exult in God's holy name; Rejoice, you who worship the Lord. Search for the Lord ad for God's strength; Continually seek God. Remember the wonders performed, Miracles, and the rulings given, You children of God's servant Abraham, You descendants of Jacob, his chosen ones. God is our Lord. God's justice is seen throughout the land. God always stands by his covenant the commitment God made to a thousand generations. Finally, you might want to offer this prayer of thanksgiving when you sit down for a meal. I have adapted it from a prayer I found on Godspace.com.

God eternal, righteous and glorious One, I give you thanks

For breath that fills me with your life, for love that softens my heart,

For beauty revealed at every turn.

Christ redeemer, faithful and forgiving One, I give you thanks

For renewal, transforming my life, for peace calming the chaos of my soul,

On Tuesday October 18 we launched our new series on Celtic Christianity.


Discovering our Celtic Roots is an online 6-weeks series. We are exploring and discovering the Celtic roots that underlie Anglican Christianity.


