

School-Based Health Clinics, Human Papillomavirus (HPV), and PARENTAL RIGHTS

HPV is a sexually transmitted disease that is passed by vaginal, anal or oral sex. According to the [Center for Disease Control \(CDC\)](#) "nearly all men and women get it at some point in their life." The CDC also states that in most cases "HPV goes away on its own within two years." When it does not go away, it can cause cancer of the cervix, vagina and vulva in women, cancer of the penis in men, cancer of the anus and back of throat in both men and women.

The pharmaceutical industry developed the HPV vaccine, such as Gardasil, in order to help prevent cancers that results from the HPV virus. The CDC also recommends that all boys and girls between the ages of 11 and 12 be vaccinated against possible future cancers...but should they?

There is considerable controversy around the efficacy of the HPV vaccine, such as Gardasil, that is currently being used to inoculate children against HPV in school-based health clinics, along with some pretty dangerous side effects. The [American College of Pediatricians](#) warns of the dangers of the Gardasil vaccine. [Dr. Kelly Brogan](#) states that "none of the HPV vaccines have been proven to prevent a single case of cervical cancer." In 2016 [Japan's](#) medical researchers issued a warning about the HPV side effects. Since July 2016, 119 girls and women in Japan have filed [lawsuits](#) against two manufacturers of the vaccine. Spain has filed 'criminal complaints' against Merck Laboratories. In a 2015 article, [Sweden tried to 'cover-up'](#) the side effects of the HPV vaccine. Locally, on February 28, 2017, Dr. Paul Thomas posted on his [Facebook site](#) that a 16 year-old patient of his experienced loss of mental awareness and lost memory for an entire day. Turns out his patient received [two HPV vaccines at Oregon's Tigard High School-Based Health Clinic when she was 15 years-old without her parents knowledge or consent](#).

A story presented on the program "Full Measure" entitled "The Growing Problem of ['Fake Science'](#) , a story regarding scientific and medical studies that, in the past, were based on independent studies at the university level. Apparently, that is not the case today. As the pharmaceutical industry has become more powerful and influential, they began taking over the sponsorships of clinical research that appears in medical journals. A claim by "respected industry leaders...made a "startling claim: that a large percentage of articles in prestigious medical journals are simply not to be believed." According to Dr. Marcia Angell of the Harvard Medical School and formerly a contributor to the New England Journal of Medicine for 20 years, indicated the clinical studies were once independent of the pharmaceutical industry, but not today. Dr. Richard Horton, of the British journal, Lancet, stated "Much of the scientific literature, perhaps half, may simply be untrue. Science has taken a turn towards the darkness."

Even more disturbing, since 2015 three states have [mandated](#) the HPV vaccine: Rhode Island, Virginia and District of Columbia. In 2011, [Governor Brown](#) of California signed

bill AB499 that gave 12-year-olds the right to consent to vaccinations without parental knowledge or consent. In 2016, the [Pennsylvania Health Department](#) tried to mandate HPV vaccines to all 7th grade boys and girls. Currently, there is an advertisement running on television in which young adults are asking the question: "Did you know mom, did you know dad?" Implying by the question, if you knew, why didn't I receive the vaccine when I was 11 or 12 years old. If they had, they would not have cancer today.

Here's where things get sticky because young people are easily indoctrinated and programmed, the HPV virus is a sexually transmitted disease. It is not contracted through holding hands, kissing or giving a person a hug, it is contracted through vaginal, anal or oral sex. Why would your 11 or 12 year-old child need the HPV vaccine if they are not sexually active? The Oregon Department of Education is pushing comprehensive sexual grooming education in which they encourage sexual experimentation, anal or oral sex, teaching students how to put a condom on a banana, how to make a dental dam, how to pleasure each other, and if it feels good...just do it. After all, according to them, it's a human right. Here's a lucrative business plan... push comprehensive sexual grooming education and then push the vaccine through the school based health clinic.

As a parent your legal rights to direct the health care of your children is being slowly eroded away by actions of the legislature at the behest of private organizations...such as Planned Parenthood. Twenty years ago the idea of the school teaching your child about anal or oral sex, prescribing contraceptives to minors, administering vaccinations or telling your child they can pick their gender, would not have been tolerated. But not today. Because of this, parents and guardians are strongly encourage to find out how to opt-out of school-based health clinic services. Keeping in mind, that currently in Oregon a 15-year-old minor can make their own health care decisions regardless of parental opt-out request.

We are not advocating either way for the vaccine, although there is a cautionary tale surrounding this drug. Our purpose is to inform parents that school-based health clinics and the Oregon Department of Education are quietly removing your authority to direct the health care of your child by legislative fiat in Salem. Senate Bill 491, passed in 2013, protecting health care providers at school-based health clinics from "civil liability" should something happen to your child after receiving health care services while at school. In

other words, they are not accountable for any harm that may befall your child because of their actions.
