


The Vatican International Exhibition The Eucharistic Miracles of the World March 11th thru March 15th

Coming to St. Patrick, York March 11th thru March 15th. This photo exhibit displays over 170 Vatican approved Eucharistic Miracles of the World. This exhibit was created by the recently beatified Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006), an English-born Italian Catholic youth and amateur computer programmer, who is best known for documenting these miracles. By means of the displayed panels, one can "virtually visit" the places where the miracles took place.



What is a Eucharistic Miracle? Eucharistic miracles consist of unexplainable phenomena occurring after transubstantiation, such as a host visibly transforming into human tissue, a host surviving fire, a host bleeding or the Eucharist alone providing sustenance to a human being for a prolonged period of time. In order to be considered a Eucharistic miracle, the event is investigated by a special task force before deciding it is worthy of belief. Secular sources are often used to investigate and confirm the miracle. Belief in approved miracles is not mandated by the Catholic Church but can reassure believers of God's presence in our world. --"Spirit Catholic Radio"



One of the most famous Eucharistic miracles occurred at the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano, Italy in 750 A.D. Here, during the mass and to the astonishment of the priest and all present, the bread and wine turned physically into visible flesh and blood.
