6 its Sixth Assessment Report on August 7, 2021, which highlights that climate change has
7 occurred at an “unprecedented” pace and notes that “it is unequivocal that human
8 influence has warmed the atmosphere, ocean and land.”;

9 WHEREAS, the IPCC Sixth Assessment Report firmly establishes that “limiting human-induced
10 global warming to a specific level requires limiting cumulative CO2 emissions, reaching
11 at least net zero CO2 emissions, along with strong reductions in other greenhouse gas
12 emissions.”;

13 WHEREAS, in 2022, the Maryland General Assembly passed the Climate Solutions Now Act,
14 which requires the state of Maryland to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 60% from
15 2006 levels by 2031 and achieve net-zero emissions by 2045;

16 WHEREAS, the preliminary report of Howard County’s Climate Action and Resiliency Plan
17 (CARP) has determined that the transportation sector accounts for approximately 55% of
18 Howard County’s local greenhouse gas emissions;

19 WHEREAS, the United States Federal Transit Administration has identified that public
20 transportation is one part of the solution to address climate change and decrease
21 greenhouse gas emissions as “public transportation produces significantly lower
22 greenhouse gas emissions per passenger mile than private vehicles.”;

23 WHEREAS, Howard County currently offers public transportation through its partnership in the
24 Regional Transportation Agency of Central Maryland (RTA), which estimates it will
25 provide 640,000 passenger trips in Howard County during FY2023;

26 WHEREAS, the Howard County Office of Transportation has identified a goal of reaching
27 1,000,000 passenger trips through the RTA bus service by FY2025 in an effort to
28 promote sustainable transportation opportunities, decrease traffic congestion, and reduce
29 air pollution in the region;

31 additional travel routes, and longer hours of operation are implemented;

22 AT THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 22.1000 OF
23 THE COUNTY CODE, THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE SHALL REPORT TO THE COUNTY
24 COUNCIL ON THE TRANSIT SERVICES IMPROVEMENT FUND , INCLUDING ON THE FINANCIAL
25 STANDING OF THE FUND, THE WAYS THE FUND HAS BEEN USED IN THE PAST YEAR, AND THE
26 PROJECTED USES OF THE FUND.

1 **Section 2. And Be It Further Enacted** by the County Council of Howard County, Maryland that
2 a transportation network company shall collect the surcharge imposed by this Act beginning 120
3 days after the effective date of this Act and submit to the Comptroller of Maryland the revenues
4 and documents in accordance with § 10-406 of the Public Utilities Article of the Maryland Code.



23 **SEC. 20.1300. TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY SERVICES ASSESSMENT.**

24 **(A) IN GENERAL.**

25 (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 10-406 OF THE PUBLIC UTILITIES ARTICLE
26 OF THE MARYLAND CODE, THERE IS A \$0.25 ASSESSMENT ON TRANSPORTATION NETWORK
27 SERVICES FOR EACH TRIP ORIGINATING IN THE COUNTY.

28 (2) THE ASSESSMENT SHALL BE COLLECTED AS PROVIDED IN § 10-406 OF THE
29 PUBLIC UTILITIES ARTICLE OF THE MARYLAND CODE.

30 **(B) TRANSIT SERVICES IMPROVEMENT FUND.**

31 (1) THERE IS A TRANSIT SERVICES IMPROVEMENT FUND.
